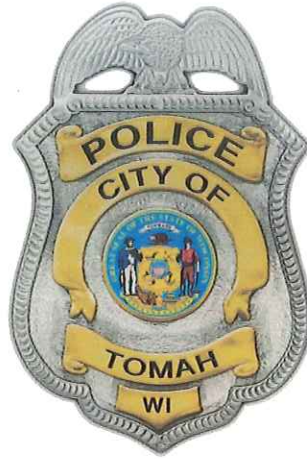

## **OPERATIONS LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES**

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of April, 2013 by Lieutenant Mark Nicholson:

Completed requests made by the City Attorney's Office and the District Attorney's office for copies of evidence related to audio, video and pictures. Managed and processed the Open Records Requests for audio and video related evidence

Conducted shift supervisor activities on many of my regularly scheduled shifts.

Assisted in the weekly monitoring of the Prescription Drug Drop off box located in the lobby of the Tomah Police Department.

Monitored and processed incoming temporary evidence, assuring that it was properly packaged and labeled. Once this was completed the evidence was processed into the evidence room. 120 pieces of evidence were processed into the Evidence Room throughout the month. Monitored and processed dispositions of cases in which evidence is to be disposed of.

Managed all schedule related issues for all sworn department members. This task included schedule variations related to comp time, vacation time, court time, training time, sick leave and special assignments.

Administered the hiring process for a part-time patrol officer and a full-time patrol officer.

Attended a Regional Alert/CTU meeting to discuss Regional Alert callouts, equipment, and capabilities.

Conducted annual inspections of all businesses which possess or are attempting to possess alcohol licenses in the City of Tomah.

Assisted in the facilitation of the department's social media networks to include Facebook and Twitter.

## **SUPPORT SERVICES LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES**

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of April, 2013 by Lieutenant Ron Waddell:

Conducted shift supervisor activities on many of my regularly scheduled shifts.

Performed Time Agency Coordinator duties.

Building maintenance issues handled as needed.

Fleet maintenance oversight continues with scheduled and unscheduled repairs. A new patrol SUV has been added to the fleet. Squad #73 will be decommissioned with all useable equipment being transferred over to the new SUV.

The department hosted another Drug Take Back event on April 27 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The event was very successful, with 41 participants dropping off unwanted or expired medications. A special thanks to Joyce Stenklyft and Administrative Assistant Rhonda Culpitt for the much needed assistance in completing tasks associated with making this event productive. Over 500 pounds of unwanted medications were disposed of.

I continue to serve on the Expanded District Facilities Meeting for the School District, with a focus on evaluating current building safety practices, then recommending changes where appropriate.

Lieutenant Nicholson and I continue to provide oversight with all items related to the evidence room, to include incoming and outgoing evidence, copying of evidence CD's and DVD's.

I completed a background investigation into the new hire for the Part-Time Police Clerk position.

Facilitated background check and scheduling of ride-along request.

## **COMBINED TACTICAL UNIT**

### **Call Out:**

No Combined Tactical Unit Callouts in April.

### **Training:**

Training was held on April 16, 2013 in Sparta. The first several hours of training were conducted in a classroom setting and consisted of the following: After Action Review of the Millstone Avenue Callout, debrief of the Association of SWAT Personnel-WI

Conference (Weaver/Pedersen/Hintz attended), debrief of the joint training with La Crosse County ERT, and briefing on upcoming training. After break the training continued at the Sparta School District Administration building where we practiced group Active Shooter / Rapid Deployment building clearing and slow and deliberate clearing with and without K-9. During the Active Shooter / Rapid Deployment training various movement techniques were practiced and pros and cons were debated. Ultimately the decision was made to conduct our Active Shooter / Rapid Deployment in the same manner we conduct our slow and deliberate searches – covering all danger areas as we move and only varying the speed based on the type of response. During the K-9 assisted searches we used a hidden decoy to attempt to covertly attack the K-9 who was in a down position in front of the team. K-9 Jager did an outstanding job alerting to and engaging the decoy. Lastly we used a blank firing handgun to simulate gunfire while the entry team was moving through the structure as an audible cue to lead the team to the suspect – event with blank ammunition fired on another floor we were able to quickly target the suspect and move to his location. We also took some time to practice using weapon mounted flashlights in different methods after one of the team members who was role playing a suspect made some observations of our response with all lights activated. Team members were able to see the distinct advantage to blipping their flashlights while moving and then going to constant light when in contact with a suspect.

### **CRIME PREVENTION/COMMUNITY RELATIONS**

The Department participated in the DEA's Fifth National Drug Take-Back Day on April 27. We collected 390 pounds of controlled substances and 110 pounds on non-controlled substances. We collected 355 pounds of controlled substances and 55 pounds of non-controlled substances in our daily drop box.

School Resource Officer Marshall assisted with the Prom and Post-Prom activities.

Chief Revels assisted with the Our Town Tomah downtown clean-up on April 26. This year we had assistance from Tomah Parks and Recreation, a group of Veterans from the Tomah Veterans Hospital, members of Roots and Shoots and members of the Young Professionals organization.

The Department held a meeting with some of the Alcoholic Beverage Licensees in the City of Tomah. We also had representation from the Monroe County Tavern League.

### **INVESTIGATIONS**

#### **[13-0533] Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated**

A Tomah Officer conducted a traffic stop on Williams St. near Butts Ave. for numerous traffic violations. The vehicle operator was trying to get away from the Officer and had turned the vehicle lights off for a brief period of time. The vehicle operator was subsequently tested for impairment and taken into custody for 2<sup>nd</sup>- offense Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated. The vehicle

operator was transported to Tomah Memorial Hospital for a legal blood draw. The blood results came back and the Blood Alcohol Concentration was determined to be .226 BAC.

**[13-0595] Use/Abuse Hazardous Substance**

Tomah Officers responded to the area of the Quality Inn for a report of an intoxicated person who was asking people for money. Officers arrived and located the subject behind a dumpster near the Cranberry Country Lodge. As Officers contacted the subject the person was in the act of 'huffing' spray paint fumes. Officers took the subject into custody and transported him to the Monroe County Jail.

**[13-608] Bail Jumping-Felony (7 counts), Operating After Revocation-OWI related**

A Tomah Officer conducted a traffic stop for an equipment violation. The operator of the vehicle was revoked and currently on several felony bonds through Monroe County. The subject's bond indicated she couldn't drive without a valid driver's license and had a curfew from 8:00pm – 8:00am. The operator was taken into custody and transported to the Monroe County Jail on numerous felony charges.

**[13-0617] Resisting Arrest, Warrant Arrest**

Tomah Officers responded to the area of King Ave. for a report of two subjects yelling. Officers had contact with a male subject while an additional male subject fled on foot. The Officer noticed an odor of alcohol coming from the person that remained on scene. This person had a warrant out of Dunn County. When the subject was informed of the warrant he became angry, agitated and aggressive. The subject ripped his jacket off and said he was going to run. The subject began to run and the Officer chased after him. The subject was ordered to stop but refused. The Officer utilized a department issued Electronic Control Device and was able to stop the subject's flight. The subject was taken into custody without further incident. The subject threatened to kill the Police Officers. The subject was taken to the Monroe County Jail.

**[13-0626] Possession of Methamphetamine, Possession of Methamphetamine paraphernalia, Bail Jumping**

Tomah Officers responded to an address on the 800 block of N. Glendale Ave. to attempt to locate a wanted subject. Officers met with a family member who claimed the subject was not at the residence. Officers asked for consent to look for the wanted subject and were granted consent. The wanted subject was located hiding inside the residence and was taken into custody. Additional investigation revealed this subject had stashed methamphetamine and paraphernalia inside a vehicle that was parked at this location. The subject was arrested and taken to jail.

**[13-0640] Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia**

Officers were dispatched to Kwik Trip South regarding a subject who appeared under the influence of an intoxicant and who might be driving from the store. A male subject was contacted and obviously under the influence of an intoxicant. The male subject consented to a search of his vehicle, which was parked in the lot, and rolling papers were located. The male subject later turned over a Baggie with marijuana (total weight 5 grams). The subject was cited and released.

## TRAINING

Investigator Sloan attended a course specializing in search warrants and affidavits.



All sworn personnel attended interdepartmental training at Recreation Park, with an emphasis on team movement and defense and arrest tactics.
