CHIEF'S ACTIVITIES

I attended a meeting of the Monroe County Safety Coalition.

I attended a budget meeting with City Administrator Bialecki, Administrative Assistant Gnewikow and Administrative Assistant Culpitt.

I conducted Administrative and Command Staff meetings.

I met with Director Williams from the Monroe County Dispatch Center.

OPERATIONS LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of August, 2011 by Lieutenant Mark Nicholson:

Completed requests' made by the City Attorney's Office and the District Attorney's office for copies of evidence related to audio, video and photographs.

Assumed command of the Department while Chief Revels was on vacation. During this time I attended two (2) City Council meetings and a City Department Heads meeting.

Attended Administrative and Command Staff meetings.

Conducted shift supervisor activities on many of my regularly scheduled shifts.

Monitored and processed incoming temporary evidence, assuring that it was properly packaged and labeled. Once this was completed the evidence was processed into the evidence room.

Managed and processed the open records requests for audio and video related evidence.

Managed all schedule-related issues for all sworn department members. This task included schedule variations related to comp time, vacation time, court time, training time, sick leave, and special assignments.

Assisted in the Medicine Take Back Program. This process entails the removal and destruction of medications that are voluntarily turned into the Tomah Police Department.

Facilitated the process of hiring a replacement officer for Officer Schneider. This included meeting with a future candidate, offering him/her a conditional offer of employment, and scheduling psychological and medical exams as needed.

Attended a meeting with the Veterans Memorial Committee to discuss traffic control and other safety related issues during the upcoming unveiling of the Veterans Memorial.

SUPPORT SERVICES LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

Attended Administrative and Command Staff meetings.

Conducted shift supervisor activities on many of my regularly scheduled shifts.

Assisted in the organization and operation of the annual Bike and Blading Safety Expoheld on August 2, 2011 in conjunction with National Night Out.

Assisted in the set-up and tear down of many items related to National Night Out.

Facilitated patrol and supervisor training schedules which including enrollment into requested training courses, making necessary lodging accommodations and providing training orders as needed.

Assisted in the Medicine Take Back Program. This process entails the removal and destruction of medications that are voluntarily turned into the Tomah Police Department

Facilitated the process of hiring a replacement officer for Officer Schneider. This included meeting with a future candidate and offering him/her a conditional offer of employment.

As Evidence Custodian facilitated the return of evidence and found property to owners.

Participated in planning and organizing traffic control for Veterans Memorial Dedication event scheduled for September 10, 2011.

Approved several ride-along requests.

COMBINED TACTICAL UNIT

Call Out:

08/02/11 – Econo Lodge / Swamp east of North Superior Avenue and North of Holland Street.

CTU Personnel had just finished our demonstration at National Night Out when CTU was requested to assist with a report of a prison escapee at the Econo Lodge. Tomah Police had responded to the Econo Lodge and verified that a subject matching the description of an escaped prisoner was checked into the motel. Tomah Police were unable to contact the suspect via telephone. CTU personnel responded and established a perimeter to contain the suspect in the room. At the same time other police personnel were able to verify that the suspect had left the area approximately 5 minute before the

police arrived. CTU personnel cleared from the area and a plan was developed to apprehend the suspect when he returned to his room. Shortly after leaving, a Monroe County Sheriff Department Detective located the suspect behind the Ho-Chunk Cinema. The suspect then fled into the swamp area south of the Cinema. CTU personnel responded to the area and assisted with the perimeter and also provided cover for two K-9 teams during the search for the suspect. The search was conducted for approximately 3 hours and was unsuccessful. The suspect was apprehended about 5 hours later just outside of the search area.

Training:

08/02/11 - National Night Out.

CTU personnel conducted a tactical demonstration for the National Night Out event at Winnebago Park in Tomah. The demonstration provided an opportunity for CTU to train for and then complete a high risk arrest of two suspects in a semi tractor. This demonstration also integrated the Sparta Police Department K-9 Unit and BEARCAT armored rescue vehicle.

Upon approaching the semi tractor one suspect fled on foot and was apprehended by the Sparta Police Department K-9. CTU personnel then used the BEARCAT for cover and moved with the K-9 handler to secure the K-9 and apprehend the suspect. Once the suspect was escorted from the area, with the BEARCAT providing cover, a team of CTU personnel moved up to the semi tractor with a pole mirror and observed the other suspect hiding in the semi. Officers then used the BEARCAT to deliver simulated chemical agent into the truck via a pole from the roof of the BEARCAT. After the second suspect was forced from the truck he was apprehended and the truck was then cleared with assistance from the Sparta Police Department K-9.

Tomah Police Department Lt. Waddell provided narration for the demonstration via a public address system at the event.

08/17/11 - Former Ray's Supermarket in Sparta.

Training was conducted at the former Ray's Supermarket in downtown Sparta. Due to the impending demolition of the building we had the opportunity to practice destructive breaching operations. Various doors and interior windows were breached with a variety of tools and techniques used.

Also, a simulated barricade situation was conducted with "live" OC rounds being fired into an interior room in one of the sections of the building.

TRAINING

All sworn personnel conducted firearms training.

Investigator Walensky attended the Wisconsin Narcotic Officer Association Conference in Green Bay.

Officers Marshall and Kenworthy attended the Governor's Conference on Highway Safety in Green Bay.

CRIME PREVENTION/COMMUNITY RELATIONS

The Monroe County National Night Out was held on August 2nd. Kasey Bloom, from Tomah Memorial Hospital led the committee that put together another successful event.

I participated in serving at the Community Dinner.

I attended Business After 5 at Fort McCoy.

Officers from the Department were assigned to the annual Platoon Run parade.

Lt. Waddell worked to coordinate with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation District 5 on traffic related concerns regarding the Veterans Memorial Committee's dedication ceremony scheduled for September 10th.

INVESTIGATIONS

[11-1346] OMVWI-4th (Felony), Operating After Revocation, Tamper/Fail to Install Ignition Interlock

A Tomah Officer stopped a vehicle after observing the operator and having prior knowledge that the operator was not valid. The operator had been consuming alcohol and field tests were conducted to determine if the operator was impaired. The operator had three prior OWI offenses and thus made his legally allowed Blood Alcohol Concentration a .02 BAC. The operator admitted that he was probably over the limit. The operator submitted to a Preliminary Breath Test and the result was .125 BAC. The operator was arrested and processed for Felony OMVWI and then transported to jail.

[11-1349] OMVWI-1st, Operating without a Valid Driver's License, Fleeing/Failure to Stop, Disorderly Conduct, Resisting an Officer

A Tomah Officer attempted to stop a vehicle after observing the operator and having prior knowledge that the operator was not valid. The vehicle did not stop and continued traveling south on STH 131 and then turned onto Schaller St., where it stopped. The vehicle operator was contacted and it was determined he had been consuming alcohol and the Officer was going to administered Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. The operator wasn't cooperative and became agitated and argumentative with Officers. The operator was taken into custody for OMVWI-1st offense. The operator was taken to Tomah

Memorial Hospital for a legal blood draw. The operator refused to cooperate during this process and created a disturbance. The operator had to be held down onto a hospital bed in order for the hospital staff to safely obtain the blood evidence. The operator was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

[11-1354] Agency Assist – Escaped Inmate

The Tomah Police Department received information from an Eau Claire County Deputy that an escaped convict from the Flambeau Correctional Institute was believed to be staying at Econo Lodge in the City of Tomah. Tomah Officers responded to this location and secured the area immediately around the suspect's room. Additional resources were requested; The Monroe County Combined Tactical Unit (CTU) was at Winnebago Park for National Night Out and this allowed an immediate response of tactical personnel, equipment and the Bearcat. CTU personnel took command of the inner perimeter and assumed cover on the suspect's room. Command Post personnel determined that the escaped convict had left the room 10 minutes prior to Officers arriving to try and locate him. All personnel departed the area and were notified by a Monroe County Deputy that he was trying to contact a person behind Ho-Chunk Cinema; this person fled into the swampy wooded area south of the cinema and Cranberry Country Lodge. An extensive search operation was developed involving numerous law enforcement personnel from the Tomah Police Department, Sparta Police Department, Monroe County Sheriff's Department and the Wisconsin State Patrol. The Command Post, in coordination with the Fort McCoy Police Department, was able to request and deploy a UH-60 Black Hawk Helicopter that's equipped with FLIR (Forward Looking Infrared), Night vision and Spotlight capabilities. The Sparta Police Department and the Onalaska Police Department were on scene and utilized their K-9's to help track the convict. Ultimately the suspect was not located. At approximately 6:30AM, the escaped convict was taken into custody at an address on Foley Ave., which is close to the original search area.

[11-1363] Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Underage Alcohol

Tomah Officers were investigating a suspicious person complaint at the Tomah U-Store It storage buildings located behind Holsum Bakery. The investigation led to contacting several subjects at a nearby apartment. Officers determined these subjects had been in the area and were probably the subjects that were seen near the storage buildings. During the investigation Officers determined all of the subjects were under the age of twenty-one and all had been consuming alcohol. The subjects gave Officers consent to enter their apartment and Officers located several items of drug paraphernalia along with one marijuana plant, that was growing in a closet. The subjects involved were cooperative and Officers decided to write them all municipal citations for the different violations. The drug items were seized and entered into evidence. The alcohol was emptied at the apartment and discarded.

[11-1366] Underage-Attempt to Procure Alcohol, Underage-Possession/Consuming Alcohol, Violation of Absolute Sobriety Law

A plainclothes Tomah Officer observed a vehicle speeding and followed it to a local gas station. The vehicle was not registered and the operator entered the store. The

plainclothes Officer followed the operator into the store and observed the operator trying to purchase alcohol. A uniformed Officer arrived and spoke with the operator. The operator was under the age of twenty-one and had been consuming alcohol. A Preliminary Breath Test indicated the operator had been consuming alcohol (.07 BAC). The operator was taken into custody for Violation of Absolute Sobriety. The operator was processed at the Tomah Police Department, cited for the various violations and released to a responsible party.

[11-1382] Physical Abuse of a Child, Bail Jumping

Tomah Officers investigated a disturbance that occurred at an address on the 300 block of W. Veterans St. The investigation revealed an 11-year-old boy had been held on the ground and struck in the face by 19-year-old female. The female fled the residence when she was informed the Police had been called. Officers made phone contact with her and she agreed to meet at the Aldi's parking lot. The suspect admitted to holding the child down and striking him in the face. The suspect is currently on bond out of Monroe County. The suspect was taken to the Monroe County Jail

[11-1389] Knowingly Fleeing an Officer, OMVWI-2nd offense, Operating After revocation, Reckless Driving, Unreasonable and Imprudent Speed

Tomah Officers were conducting foot patrol in the downtown bar district when they observed a vehicle traveling at a very high rate of speed northbound on Superior Ave. An Officer was patrolling the northern portion of the City and located the vehicle. The vehicle fled from the Officer and a high speed pursuit ensued. The vehicle fled past County Highway O and came to a stop in the construction on US highway 12, north of Tomah. The Officers had contact with a female operator that they were able to determine had just changed seats with the actual operator. The operator of the vehicle, at the time of the pursuit, was located hiding under a sweatshirt in the backseat. The operator was taken into custody and taken to Tomah Memorial Hospital for a legal blood draw. The operator admitted to traveling at speeds of 120 MPH. The operator was taken to the Monroe County Jail.
