

POLICE CHIEF WES REVELS

CHIEF'S ACTIVITIES

I met with William Blanchard regarding his plans to start a business that would provide for activities that the younger residents of the city may use for leisure time entertainment. Activities such as skateboarding and video/arcade gaming.

I met with the Coordinated Service Team. This is a group of agency representatives who are working together to assist specific families in identifying their most significant problems and needs and then responding to these needs and problems in the least restrictive setting possible. The coordinator, Ryan Schaller, develops an individualized plan, incorporating the strengths of the child, family, and team members to work toward identified goals.

I attended the Committee As A Whole and Common Council meetings.

I conducted an Administrative Staff meeting.

Interviews for the part-time custodian position were held on December 27, 2010.

Interviews for our vacant part-time clerical position were held on December 22, 2010.

I conducted a Command Staff meeting.

OPERATIONS LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

Conducted Shift Supervisor duties on many of my scheduled shifts.

Monitored and processed incoming temporary evidence assuring proper packaging and identification was affixed.

Managed the filling of open records for video evidence to the public.

Managed all schedule-related issues for all sworn department members (comp, vacation, training, special assignment).

Attended a Command Staff Meeting with the Supervisory Staff of the Tomah Police Department.

Facilitate MEG supervisor duties (overseeing investigations, request reimbursement, submit monthly stats).

Participated in the interview process for the part-time custodial position at the Police Department.

Attended an Ambassadors meeting held by the Tomah Chamber of Commerce.

SUPPORT SERVICES LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of December, 2010 by Lieutenant Mark Nicholson:

I completed Evidence Custodian duties related to the recovery, retention, and disposal of evidence. For the month of December 113 pieces of evidence were processed into the evidence room.

I attended inter-departmental meetings to include an Administrative Staff Meeting and a Command Staff Meeting.

I prepared three reports for the Tomah Police Department Annual Report. Those reports include the 2010 Information Technology Report, the 2010 Grants Awarded to the Tomah Police Department Report, and the 2010 Field Training and Evaluation Annual Report.

During the month of December I prepared for and scheduled several different training sessions for officers within the Tomah Police Department. These included department training sessions as well as classes and conferences that officers may be attending.

I attended an Information Technology meeting with employees from the City Hall. The reason for the meeting was to discuss issues with our current Anti-virus software.

Participated in the interviews for the purpose of filling the part-time clerk position.

TRAINING

Officer Hintz attended Drug Identification training.

Officer Keller attended Identifying Deceptive Behavior training.

CRIME PREVENTION/COMMUNITY RELATIONS

We held a luncheon for the news media on December 15, 2010 at 11:00 a.m. in the Community Room at the police department. The luncheon was not very well attended. However, the event did give us the opportunity to address any concerns that Steve Rundio, Editor of the Tomah Journal had regarding the availability of information.

I attended the weekly Rotary Club meetings. The Rotary Club is organizing the 1st Annual Freeze Fest in partnership with the Tomah Parks and Recreation Department.

I assisted the Rotary Club of Tomah at the Senior Citizen Christmas Party.

INVESTIGATIONS

10-2678] Interfering With Child Custody (Felony)/Contributing to Delinquency of Minor/Obstructing an Officer

Tomah Officers received information that a 16-year-old juvenile had run away from his residence in the State of California and was believed to be traveling by Grey Hound to an address in Monroe County, WI. The Grey Hound Bus Depot was checked several times for the juvenile as it was believed the juvenile would be arriving in Tomah. Two days after the Tomah Police Department received this information Tomah Officers observed a vehicle that matched a vehicle from a residence in Monroe County where this juvenile was supposed to be going. The vehicle was stopped and the juvenile was located in the backseat. The adult female was not cooperative with Law Enforcement and was actually aiding the juvenile by taking him to the adult female's residence. The adult female had previously been contacted by the Monroe County Sheriff's Department and instructed to report the location of the juvenile as soon as the adult female knew. The adult female had driven past the Tomah Police Department while she was enroute to her residence, making it clear that she wasn't interested in following the required instructions from Law Enforcement and in fact was interfering with a child custody matter. The adult female was taken to Jail.

[10-2698] Disorderly Conduct (Domestic Related)

Tomah Officers were dispatched to the 300 block of E. Juneau St. for a reported disturbance. Officers proceeded to the area of the call and observed two male subjects walking on the sidewalk. The male subjects observed the marked Police vehicle and one of them began to run. The Officer contacted the male subject that remained at the location and began to investigate the altercation. Tomah Officers were able to track down the subject that fled and he was taken into custody. The male subject that fled was issued a citation for Underage Consumption of Alcohol and was released. The male subject that remained on scene was taken into custody for his involvement in the original disturbance.

[10-2699] Substantial Battery (Felony)/Disorderly Conduct

Tomah Officers were dispatched to The Hearty Platter for a report that a male subject was beating a female subject. Officers arrived and were informed that the male subject had slammed the female's face into a table and had also dragged her from the restaurant. The vehicle was located east of Tomah on State Highway 21. The victim suffered a broken tooth from having her head slammed into the table. The victim wasn't cooperative with Law Enforcement. Ultimately the male subject was taken into custody for Disorderly Conduct (Domestic related) and transported to the Monroe County Jail. The male subject will have a charge of Substantial Battery referred to the District Attorney's Office.

[10-2702] Violation of Closing Hours

A Tomah Officer observed several subjects inside The Bank Bar after closing hours. The Officer entered the bar and observed approximately ten subjects standing at the bar with drinks in front of them. The bar tender observed the Officer and began taking the drinks and instructing the patrons that they needed to leave. The Officer told the Patrons that they needed to leave and they all slowly departed the bar. The Officer walked around the bar and observed a male subject passed out on the floor behind the bar. The bar tender indicated the male subject that was passed out was her boy friend. The Tomah Officer summonsed additional assistance to check on the welfare of the male subject that was lying on the floor behind the bar. The Tomah Officers were able to verify that the male subject was okay and he was escorted off the premises. The bar tender was issued a citation and released.

[10-2705] OMVWI-2nd Offense

Tomah Officers were dispatched to the area of Kwik Trip-west and the Wal-Mart Supercenter for a report of a possibly intoxicated driver. Additional information was that a vehicle operator was observed buying alcohol and then seen trying to leave the area and ran into a snow bank. Officers subsequently located the vehicle in the Wal-Mart Super Center parking lot. The vehicle operator submitted to Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) and also submitted to a Preliminary Breath Test (PBT) and the result of that test was .169BAC, which confirmed the Officers suspicion that the operator was impaired with alcohol. The operator was taken into custody for Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated – 2nd offense. The operator was processed at the Tomah Police Department and ultimately released to his father. A passenger in the vehicle was issued a citation for Open Intoxicant as a Passenger and Adult Sell/Serve/Disperse Alcohol to an Intoxicated Subject.

[10-2706] Battery to Police Officer (Felony)/Disorderly Conduct/Resisting Arrest/Mistreatment of Animal

Tomah Officers were dispatched to the 500 block of Benton St. for a reported disturbance. Upon arrival Officers were allowed into the residence and began to speak with a male and female subject. The male subject was immediately belligerent and stated he wanted to go to jail. The male subject attempted to leave, after being instructed not to, and Officers attempted to prevent him from leaving. The male subject turned around and punched an Officer in the face. The male subject continued to resist arrest and was ultimately controlled with the use of an Electronic Control Device. While Officers were dealing with the combative male, the female subject began to become belligerent. The female subject was told she was under arrest and she turned around and kicked a dog in the ribs as she was being taken into custody. Both subjects were transported to the Monroe County Jail.

[10-2707] Attempted Robbery (Felony)

Tomah Officers were dispatched to the 1500 block of Superior Ave. for a suspicious activity call. Additional information was provided that described two male subjects (Possibly juveniles) that left the area and were involved with the suspicious activity. Tomah Officers were able to determine that the two male juveniles had stopped the victim, an adult male, and asked him how much money he had. The victim told the two

juveniles and they then told the victim to follow them into the alley where they stated they were going to beat him up and take his money. The victim told the two juveniles that he was calling the Police and the two juveniles called him a "Snitch" and departed the area. The two juveniles admitted to speaking with the victim and asking him how much money he had but didn't admit to trying to rob the victim. The Tomah Police Department established probable cause and arrested the two juveniles for Attempted Robbery. The two juveniles were ultimately released to their respective parent. The two juveniles will be referred to the Monroe County Department of Human Services for Attempted Robbery.

[10-2709] Substantial Battery (Felony)

Tomah Officers were dispatched to the 1000 block of Superior Ave. for a reported physical altercation. Additional information was that a male subject had been struck in the head with a cane. Officers spoke with the complainant and determined that he and another male subject got involved in a fight and the complainant struck the other male with a wooden cane causing this subject to bleed profusely from the head. The subject that was hit with the cane was located and taken to Tomah Memorial Hospital where he received six staples to close the wound. The complainant was referred for Substantial Battery (Felony) and the other male was arrested on a Probation violation and taken to jail.

COMMENDATIONS

The department receives most of the child's descriptive information and a list of things that they need from Families First. This is an anonymous giving process.
