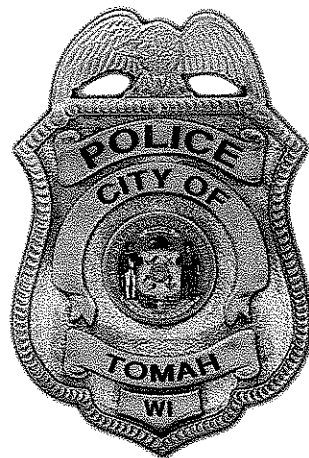

**POLICE CHIEF WES REVELS**

## **CHIEF'S ACTIVITIES**

I attended a meeting of the Interact leadership group at the Tomah Senior High.

I attended a meeting of the Tomah Police and Fire Commission. We discussed the final changes in the Commission's Rules and Regulations.

I met with Chief O'bong from the Veteran's Administration regarding an agency assist.

I attended a meeting of the Coordinated Service Team. The group now has at least two families requesting services.

I met with the Monroe County Safety Coalition.

I attended a meeting of the Local Emergency Planning Committee.

I met with the Monroe County Dispatch Director, Randy Williams.

## **OPERATIONS LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES**

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of February, 2011 by Lieutenant Mark Nicholson:

I worked on two Personnel Complaints; 10-4 and 11-11-01.

I attended Department Training. The training included instruction provided by the FBI in child abductions, information provided to the Department by Brighter Tomorrows, and information provided to the department by Chief Revels.

I completed requests made by the City Attorney's Office and the District Attorney's office for copies of evidence related to audio, video and pictures.

I conducted shift supervisor activities on many of my regularly scheduled shifts.

I monitored and processed incoming temporary evidence, assuring that it was properly packaged and labeled. Once this was completed the evidence was processed into the evidence room.

I managed and processed the open records requests for audio and video related evidence.

I managed all schedule-related issues for all sworn department members. This task included schedule variations related to comp time, vacation time, court time, training time, sick leave, and special assignments.

## **SUPPORT SERVICES LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES**

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of February, 2011 by Lieutenant Ron Waddell:

Conducted Shift Supervisor duties on many of my scheduled shifts.

Monitored and processed incoming temporary evidence assuring proper packaging and identification was affixed.

Managed the filling of open records for video evidence to the public.

Filled video evidence request from the DA and City Attorney that were to be used in the prosecution of municipal or circuit court cases.

Managed all schedule-related issues for all sworn department members (comp, vacation, training, special assignment).

Attended a meeting with Tomah High School representatives that included discussions about the School Resource Officer, upcoming events, and school safety.

Facilitate MEG supervisor duties (overseeing investigations, request reimbursement, submit monthly stats).

Lt. Nicholson and I have switched jobs. Along with this role change came the responsibility of training one another in specific job duties.

Several hundred pounds of medications were taken to a collection depot. These were medications obtained during a drug take back event and from the Tomah Police Department medication drop box.

I was part of a team that cooperatively with the Tomah VA Housing Program, our K9 unit and the Sparta PD K-9 Unit that insured a drug free facility existed by virtue of a K-9 search.

## **COMBINED TACTICAL UNIT**

Sheriff Quirin administered the Deputy Sheriff Oath to officers of the Sparta Police Department and Tomah Police Department that were present.

Sergeant Ames of the Sparta Police Department and Sergeant Weaver of the Tomah Police Department conducted classroom training. The training consisted of a reviewing of incidents that were debriefs at the Association of Special Weapons and Tactics conference. This training took longer than anticipated, but

was very valuable. The incident debriefs included a Multiple Homicide Suspect Rural Manhunt in Marinette County, WI; a 17-hour Hostage Incident in Pittsburgh, California; a 56-Hour Barricaded Gunman with Child Hostage Incident in Sacramento, California; a Rural 28-hour Manhunt for a Homicide Suspect in Fresno County, California; and three reviews of Sniper Resolution to Armed Suspect Incidents in Kansas City, MO. Attending the conference and bringing back the information to present to the group was very worthwhile. The presentation generated valuable discussions as to how we would resolve the incidents.

The Combined Tactical Unit was not activated for any call outs in February.

### **SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER ACTIVITIES**

On February 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Officer Marshall attended the School Resource Officer Conference in Appleton, WI.

Officer Marshall responded to four Disorderly Conduct calls from LaGrange School to deal with a 6 year-old. Since this has started I have met jointly with Monroe County Human Services, the LaGrange School staff and the child's parents regarding how to handle this child and alternative measures available to the child.

Officer Marshall investigated four Disorderly Conduct incidents at Tomah High School. Two of the students received municipal citations; one student was arrested and transported to jail. The same student was referred to the District Attorney's Office for Disorderly Conduct related to a second incident. One of the students was referred to Monroe County Human Services for disorderly conduct and held for social services until a transport could be arranged.

Officer Marshall referred one student from the Tomah Middle School to Monroe County Human Services for Disorderly Conduct and issued a citation to one student for possessing a knife. This investigation also disclosed students who were bringing pills to school and exchanging them.

Officer Marshall referred a student from the Lemonwier School to Monroe County Human Services for Disorderly Conduct. The student was yelling, swearing, and threatened staff and students prior to leaving the school. The ten year-old was picked up and transported to the PD and later released to mother.

### **TRAINING**

The February Departmental was provided by F.B.I. Supervisory Agent Ray Greco. S/A Greco instructed the Department on Child Abductions.

Lieutenant Waddell, Lieutenant Nicholson and I attended the Wisconsin Chief's Mid-Winter Training Conference.

Officer Marshall attended the School Resource Officer training conference.

Sergeant Weaver attended the Association of S.W.A.T Personnel training.

Officer Westpfahl attended Instructor Development.

### CRIME PREVENTION/COMMUNITY RELATIONS

I attended a dinner with the Heeler/Grandview Neighborhood Watch group.

I met with Reporter Jessica Larsen from the Tomah Journal. Jessica was doing an article on local law enforcement assisting at the Capitol with monitoring the protesters.

### INVESTIGATIONS

The Tomah Police Department received over 20 reports of Criminal Damage to Property that were directly related to someone shooting the property with a pellet and/or BB gun.

#### **[11-0184] Strangulation and Suffocation/ Battery/Disorderly Conduct**

Tomah Officers responded to the 800 block of Kilbourn Ave. for a reported domestic disturbance. Officers arrived on scene and met with the female victim and the male suspect was located a short distance away. The investigation revealed that there was a verbal argument that escalated to a physical one when the male suspect began hitting and choking the female. The female subject believed she was going to die. The male subject was taken into custody and transported to the Monroe County Jail.

#### **[11-0202] Disorderly Conduct, Resisting Arrest**

Tomah Officers responded to the Band Box Cleaners located on the 300 block of Superior Ave. for a report that a male subject had just been beaten up. Officers arrived on scene and met with the victim who indicated he had been punched and kicked repeatedly in and about the head area. Officers were able to locate the suspects at an address on the 500 block of Glendale Ave. Officers located one of the suspects hiding in the house. The suspect began to fight with the Officer. The suspect was controlled with an Electronic Control Device and was taken into custody. During this arrest several family members interfered and caused on-scene Police personnel to request immediate emergency assistance from any other Law Enforcement in the area. The family members were out of control and the father of the suspect being arrested wanted to physically fight the

Police. Ultimately the suspect, his Father and another relative were all taken to the Monroe County Jail on a variety of charges.

**[11-0242] Possession of Marijuana with Intent to Manufacture/Deliver/Distribute/ Possession of Marijuana**

Tomah Officers received information from the West Central Drug Task Force in the Eau Claire/Altoona area that there was going to be a controlled drug transaction taking place in the City of Tomah. Additional information was that the transaction was going to involve three pounds of high grade marijuana and it would be sold for \$15,000. Tomah Officers, with the assistance of the Drug Task Force personnel, were able to successfully take the suspect into custody. Three pounds of marijuana and all the money were recovered from the suspect vehicle. The suspect was taken to the Monroe County jail.

**[11-0255] Discharging Firearm within City Limits**

Tomah Officers were dispatched to the area of Dogwood Lane for a report that several gun shots were heard. The investigation revealed that two male juveniles were observed carrying a bow case into the woods and a short time later several gun shots were heard. Officers were able to locate the two juvenile suspects as they walked across the airfield towards the dead end at E. Monowau St. One of the two juveniles had a loaded .22 caliber revolver in his waistline when contacted by Police. Officers eventually released the two juveniles to either their parent or a responsible adult. The two juveniles indicated they were shooting at squirrels.

**[11-0315] Possession of Cocaine/Possession of Cocaine with Intent to Deliver**

A Tomah Officer was parked in the Burnstad's Parking lot and observed two vehicles pull into the parking lot. A male subject from one of the vehicles got into the other vehicle and was observed handing something to a female passenger. The Officer believed a drug transaction took place and stopped one of the vehicles to investigate. The investigation revealed the male subject had sold 1 gram of powder cocaine to the female subject. The male subject was in possession of 29 grams of powder cocaine and over \$2,000 in US Currency. The cocaine and money was seized and the male subject will be referred to the Monroe County District Attorney's Office.

**[11-0320] Attempted Batter to Law Enforcement/Resisting Arrest/Disorderly Conduct/Criminal Damage to Property**

Tomah Officers were dispatched to an address on the 800 block of Williams St. for a reported disturbance. Officers arrived on scene and could hear several people screaming. Officers entered the residence and observed a male subject standing in the living room that was clearly agitated and out of control. This male subject had two females and a male cornered in the kitchen area. Officers order the male subject to lie on the ground. The male subject did not comply and was controlled with an Electronic Control Device. The male subject then tried to kick

an Officer but fortunately the Officer was able to move and catch the kick. The male subject was carried to a squad car and ultimately was transported to the Monroe County Jail. Two Officers were injured trying to control the physically resistive subject.

[11-0336] **Attempted Battery to Law Enforcement/Resisting Arrest/Warrant**  
A Tomah Officer was on patrol and observed a male subject lying in the roadway on the 100 block of W. Monowau St. The male subject eventually stood up and began stumbling down the middle of the roadway. The Officer decided to check on the subject and make sure he was okay. The male subject was highly intoxicated and wasn't following simple instructions from the Officers. Officers determined the male subject had a warrant out of Milwaukee County. Officer attempted to place the male subject in custody but the male subject tried punching one of the Officers in the face. The subject ultimately was taken into custody and transported to the Monroe County Jail.

### **COMMENDATIONS**

My thanks goes out to all of the Department personnel that assisted with the drug arrest that occurred in Tomah as a result of information that we received from the West Central Drug Task Force in the Eau Claire/Altoona area. The arrest netted three pounds of high grade marijuana that was being purchased for \$15,000.00.

The Department's thanks goes out to Officer Jarrod Furlano for his participation in a fundraiser event for Special Olympics. The event was organized by the Onalaska Police Department and held at Buffalo Wild Wings.
