

JANUARY 2010 REPORT

POLICE CHIEF WES REVELS

CHIEF'S ACTIVITIES:

I attended an overview of a new restorative justice initiative that has been created in La Crosse County. The program is called the La Crosse County Veteran's Court Initiative and is designed to assist Veterans who have entered the Criminal Justice System. The initiative will identify those Veterans in need of services and match them with a mentor who will assist in obtaining the necessary resources. I will stay abreast of the progress of this program for the purpose of making future recommendations to the Monroe County Justice Coordinating Council.

The Department hosted a meeting of the Coulee Region Law Enforcement Executive Group. Approximately twenty-five members attended the meeting. We discussed issues related to mutual aid agreements, the regional tactical response team concepts, crime mapping and social networking as a tool for law enforcement agencies.

I'm continuing to work with City Administrator Bialecki and Attorney Berry for the purpose of bringing recommendations to the Common Council regarding Labor negotiations.

The Department hosted a meeting of the Monroe County Safety Coalition. This year we are increasing our involvement in the program titled, "Parents Who Host Lose the Most: Don't Be a Party to Underage Drinking" which is an element of the Alcohol and Drug Abuse School Community Alliance Coalition. The program is a relatively new project that is currently in over 50 communities in Wisconsin. The program is a coordinated effort involving parents, educators, police departments, health care providers and community leaders from all parts of the state working together to prevent and reduce underage drinking.

I met with the Our Town Tomah in January to begin the discussion related to the spring clean-up. We've scheduled the spring cleanup to take place on April 23 from 8:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. We will be receiving assistance from the Monroe County Community Services Program, some of Tomah's business owners and the environmental group, Roots and Shoots from the Tomah Senior High School.

The Dog Ordinance work group continues to make progress. The process of reviewing the current ordinances is nearing completion. The next stage of the process will be to discuss areas that are in need of additional language. The focus of any additional language will emphasize responsible pet ownership and commonly regulated behaviors.

Annually, the Wisconsin Department of Justice sponsors a training program for new Police Chiefs and Sheriffs. I was asked to present this year. I presented a short block of instruction on Community Partnerships.

I'm work with City Administrator Bialecki and Director Protz on the issues related to the Farmers Market.

The Combined Tactical Unit trained on January 20 at the Tomah Police Department. Training consisted of classroom lecture on Flashbangs and Chemical Agents and ended with a group planning exercise on deploying chemical agents.

Sergeant Preuss, Investigator Walensky and Officer Marshall attended a training program on the topic of death notifications.

Administrative assistant Culpitt and Officer Kenworthy began an online supervisory program.

The January Interdepartmental Training consisted of updates of the use of the Taser and the application of Defense and Arrest Tactics.

Lieutenant Waddell and Sergeant Holum attended the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Executive Development Association annual training program.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

Listed below are totals related to the type of contacts that School Resource Officer Marshall had during the month of January.

A middle school student was found to be in possession of a small bottle of alcohol at the school. Student was cited municipally.

A Quick 50 Tip resulted in the recovery of marijuana from a high school student. The student was cited municipally for possession of marijuana and tobacco.

A student was cited for theft after stealing food from the cafeteria.

Two students were cited by Officer Stafford after fighting with each other at school.

Sexting case where a middle school male sent pictures of himself to a female and she in turn sent him pictures as well. All students counseled and informational report sent to Juneau County Human Services.

Officer Walters cited a student for possession of tobacco at THS.

Assisted Monroe County Human Services with a complaint of an eight year old boy with bruises believed to have come from his older brother. A previous case had been investigated but unsubstantiated; however Human Services had offered services to the family. Interviews were conducted at school with the victim and a sibling. During an interview with the fifteen year old suspect he admitted to causing injury to his younger brother. The fifteen year old was taken into custody by Human Services and placed into the group home.

Information received that a registered sex offender was going to an elementary school to have lunch with his daughter. He and the school were advised that he should not have contact at school, unless it is approved by his probation agent.

Assisted MCHS with a welfare check and report of sexual abuse to a sixteen year old at THS. Human services made arrangements with family members in regards to the care of the child. Child denied sexual abuse but further interviews will be conducted.

Officer Walters had contact with a juvenile male who was reported as a runaway. He was also cited for truancy.

Officer Sloan investigated the burglary to the high school in which two people were arrested for numerous charges.

A Quick 50 Tip resulted in the recovery of a baggie of marijuana. One student cited municipally for possession of marijuana.

Conducted a Chapter 51 evaluation on a seventeen year old male after he made statements in regards to dying. It was determined he was not an immediate threat and his family advised they would report this to the therapist. Parents of the students whom the male spoke with were not happy and believed their children were at risk even though no threat was made towards them.

A student stabbed another with a pencil causing injury. Student was cited municipally for disorderly conduct.

CRIME PREVENTION/COMMUNITY RELATIONS

The Department in cooperation with the Tomah Area School District, sponsored a luncheon in honor of the School Crossing Guards.

I attended two the weekly Rotary meetings.

I met with the youth leadership group from the Tomah Senior High School named Interact.

I appeared on the Magnum Radio Morning Mix show. I spoke about pedestrian safety and our Community Pride program.

I assisted representatives from the American Legion as a judge during their Regional Speech Contest.

We took three high school students to lunch at McDonald's for the Community Pride Program.

INVESTIGATIONS

[10-0047] Burglary, Theft, Criminal Damage to Property, Trespassing

Tomah Officers responded to an address on McLean Ave. for a reported burglary. Upon arrival Officers determined that a person or persons had forcefully gained entry to the residence. Officers obtained the name of a suspect and subsequently had contact with this subject. The subject admitted to breaking into the residence and stealing several thousand dollars worth of items (Jewelry, Clothes, and Credit Cards etc.). The majority of the items stolen were returned to the victim. The remaining items were located at Pioneer Pawn and had been pawned by the subject responsible for the burglary. The subject was taken into custody and transported to the Monroe County Jail. The subject was also on Probation.

[10-0050] OWI-5th (Felony), Operating After Revocation-OWI related, Resisting Arrest, Disorderly Conduct

Tomah Police conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle that was being operated without the headlamps on. The vehicle operator was determined to be impaired and was taken into custody for Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated -5th Offense and Operating After Revocation. Officers transported the vehicle operator to Tomah Memorial Hospital for a legal blood draw. Once at the hospital the subject refused the legal blood draw and began to physically fight with the Officers. The subject was controlled with the use of an Electronic Control Device (ECD/TASER) and the Officers and hospital staff were able to safely obtain the blood evidence. The subject was not injured and was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

[10-0107] Recklessly Endangering Safety, Endangering Safety-Reckless Use of a Firearm, Endangering Safety by use of a Dangerous Weapon, Disorderly Conduct

Tomah Police responded to the 500 block of Clark St. for a disturbance. Upon arrival Officers obtained information that one of the involved subjects had pointed a rifle at the chest of another subject. Police obtained a telephonic search warrant for the subject's apartment and were able to safely take the subject into custody. The subject told Police that he/she never had a weapon. A search of the residence revealed a .22 caliber rifle that matched the description provided by the victim. There was also a pistol located in the residence; both firearms were seized by the Police. The suspect was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

[10-0155] Bail Jumping, Possession of Marijuana w/ Intent to Distribute, Possession of Marijuana

Tomah Officers were conducting foot patrol in the downtown bar district and observed a male subject pounding on the outside of a vehicle. Officers determined this subject had been consuming alcohol and is currently on bond conditions with "No Drink" provisions. This subject was taken into custody for bail jumping. Officers conducted a search of the subject, incident to a lawful arrest, and located several baggies of marijuana. The marijuana appeared to be packaged for individual sale. The subject was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

[10-0160] Underage Person on Premises w/o Guardian, UA Possession Consumption of Alcohol, UA on Premises-Owner Responsibility, UA Person Furnishing Alcohol to a Minor, Obstructing

Tomah Officers responded to The Break Away Bar for a report of possible underage subjects being in the bar. Upon arrival Officers were able to determine there was at least one under age subject that had been seen walking into the bar. The bartender did not cooperate with the investigation and provided false information to the Officers. An underage and intoxicated subject was located in the basement of the bar. This subject had been served alcohol by the bartender. The underage subject was removed from the bar and cited accordingly. The bartender was also cited for the alcohol violations as well as for providing false information to the Police (Obstructing).

[10-0161] Burglary, Criminal Damage to Property, Theft, Bail Jumping (Felony), Probation and Parole Hold

Tomah Officers were dispatched to the Tomah High School for a reported Burglary. Upon arrival Officers were able to determine that a subject or subjects had forcibly entered the school property. Taken during the burglary were several items of food and electronic equipment. Officers began to investigate and their investigation led to an address on Clark St. in the City of Tomah. Two subjects were located at this address and both admitted to their respective involvement in the burglary. Both subjects were taken into custody and transported to the Monroe County Jail.
