TRAINING

I attended the training we organized in partnership with the Monroe County Medical Society and Tomah Memorial Hospital. This was an opportunity for law enforcement and members of the medical professional to learn from the experiences of each other. At the end of the meeting it became evidence that both law enforcement and the medical professionals share many of the same concerns regarding fraudulently obtained prescription drugs. We are currently in discussions as to what path we should take to make it more difficult to fraudulently obtain prescription narcotics in Monroe County.

I volunteered at the Boys and Girls Club annual golf outing.

I attended an Ice Cream Social organized by the Heeler/Grandview Neighborhood Watch.

INVESTIGATIONS

[09-1374] Possession of Marijuana x3, Possession of Paraphernalia, Possession of a Switchblade Knife

Officers were requested by an employer to perform a welfare check on an employee who had not reported to work in several days and did not answer his telephone. Upon arrival officers made contact with the male subject who was highly intoxicated and in need of services. In plain view were drug paraphernalia, marijuana and a switchblade knife. This subject was taken to a medical facility on a voluntary alcohol commitment.

[09-1387] Disorderly Conduct x4, Battery, Substantial Battery

Officers were in the downtown district investigation an unrelated call when a citizen requested their assistance with a fight occurring in front of another establishment. Upon arrival officers observed a fight in progress. A witness advised that the male subject entered a cab and threw a drink at a female subject and then struck her. This female subject then exited the tab and struck the male. The end result was that the male subject then repeatedly struck the female subject causing injury, which resulted in the female being transported by ambulance to a medical facility. The primary male aggressor was arrested and transported to jail for two counts of disorderly conduct, substantial battery and battery. The female and other male involved in the incident were cited for disorderly conduct.

[09-1397] Physical Abuse to a Child, Simple Battery

Officers were dispatched to the 1400 block of Superior Avenue regarding a child abuse complaint. Information was provided that a subject had observed a picture of a male with bruising on his back due to possibly being hit with a bicycle chain by his parent. The investigation revealed that his parent had, in fact, struck him with a belt causing the injury and bruising documented in the photo. A female subject was arrested and transported to jail. The juvenile was placed out of the home by human services.

[09-1410] Physical Abuse to a Child x3, Intimidation of a Victim, Obstructing an Officer

Officers received a telephone call from an anonymous subject who advised He /She observed a 5-year-old child being physically abused by his/her mother. He / She stated that the victim was forced to sit against a wall with his/her arms up and legs bent as if he/she was sitting in a chair (wall sits). During this time adults would twist the child's arms. He / She also stated that the child was struck with a belt by his/her mother. Officers responded to the 200 block of James Street and met with the parents of the victim. The investigation revealed that the abuse was substantiated and that the parent threatened the abused child while officers were waiting to speak with the victim. The children were removed from the home by human services. The mother of the victim was arrested and transported to jail. An adult male and two adult females were referred to the district attorney for charges.

[09-1446] Battery to a Police Officer-Not Aggravated, Resisting an Officer

Officers were requested for assistance at the VA. Upon arrival they had contact with a male subject who was in custody and had already assaulted a VA police officer by kicking him in the leg. When attempting to take this subject into custody he actively resisted arrest and again went after the same VA police officer. This subject was arrested and transported to jail.

[09-1447] Disorderly Conduct-Alcohol Related x 2

While on foot patrol in the downtown bar district, officers were requested inside Dimension's for an altercation that took place between two patrons. The investigation revealed that one male subject had struck another male subject after he believed that this male subject had put his cigarette out on his head. Uninvolved patrons confirmed this information. Both subjects were cited and released.

[09-1479] Criminal Damage to Property-Less than \$4,000 x 5

An investigation was completed into ongoing damage to property at the gazebo located Gillette Park. This investigation resulted in 5 juveniles admitting to their involvement in this incident. All five were cited for Criminal Damage to Property – Less than \$4,000 and restitution was requested.

[09-1516] OWI-2nd, OWI-5th, Hit & Run to Unattended Vehicle, Failure to Notify Police of an Accident, Operating with Prohibited Blood Alcohol Content, OAR, Possession Prescription Drug with Intent to Deliver, Possession of Prescription Drug Without Prescription, Prescription Obtained Fraudulently, Schedule IV Drug-Mfg/Del/Dist, Possession of Scheduled IV Drug, Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Paraphernalia, Obstructing an Officer

Officers were dispatched to the 900-block area of Butts Ave. in reference to a possible fight. Officers located a male subject leaving the area on foot and determined that another male subject had left the area in a vehicle. Investigation revealed that the first male subject had driven the vehicle to the location and then the second male subject had driven the vehicle from the location to his residence. Both subjects were under the

influence of alcohol and other substance(s) and were arrested. The first male subject was transported to Tomah Memorial Hospital for a legal blood draw and released to a responsible party. The second male subject was transported to Tomah Memorial Hospital for a legal blood draw and transported to jail. During the course of the investigation it was learned that the subjects had struck a parked car and fled without reporting the accident. A female subject was cited for obstructing after officers interviewed her regarding who was operating the vehicle and where that subject had been prior to officer's arrival at his residence and she provided false information to officers.

Dear Chief Revels and Mayor Thompson:

I would like to thank you for your grant application under the COPS Hiring Recovery Program (CHRP). The COPS Office received an overwhelming response to this year's CHRP grant application solicitation. Nearly 7,300 CHRP applications requesting over 39,000 officers and \$8.3 billion in funds were submitted to the COPS Office, while \$1 billion was available for the program.

As you may know, the COPS Office's first CHRP award announcement occurred on July 28, 2009. With an abundance of high-quality grant applications and a limited amount of funding available, COPS was faced with many difficult funding decisions. Many applicant requests were reduced due to the high demand relative to the amount of funding available, with the goal of distributing CHRP officers to a greater number of jurisdictions. Ultimately, however, COPS was able to fund only 1,046 (14%) of the 7,272 CHRP requests received during the 2009 solicitation. Unfortunately, your CHRP proposal was not selected for the July 28th announcement.

Although your agency was not among those announced, please note that your CHRP funding request *has not* been denied. Currently, your CHRP application remains under a "pending" status within the COPS Office, which means that the proposal is still under consideration. Once the COPS Office receives our Fiscal Year 2010 appropriations, we will know whether additional hiring funds are available and can then determine how best to proceed with all pending requests. There is no action required of your agency at this time. The COPS Office will contact you if additional information is needed.

Please note that funding selections for this announcement were based upon a variety of factors, including (but not limited to) statutory mandates which govern how CHRP and other COPS hiring funds are to be allocated, as well as each applicant's fiscal health, UCR-reported crime, and community policing plans.
