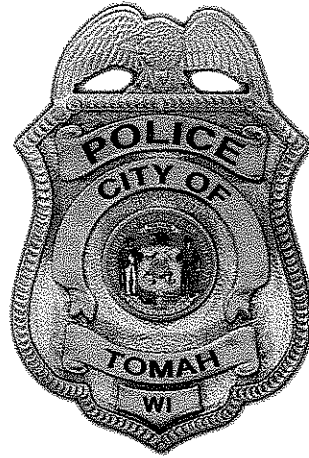

POLICE CHIEF WES REVELS

CHIEF'S ACTIVITIES

I attended the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration training summit. Some of the agenda items were: Providing Safer Highway Through Traffic Enforcement, Line-of-Duty Deaths Related to Traffic Crashes, Traffic Safety is Public Safety, Motorcycle fatalities, Combating Impaired Driving, Technology Available to Law Enforcement and Nighttime Seatbelt Enforcement.

I attended a meeting of the Monroe County Safety Coalition.

Grand National Tractor Pull

The calls for service related to The Grand National Tractor Pull were a small number when considering the size of the event.

Arrest Information on grounds:

One subject was arrested for disorderly conduct and resisting. Four subjects were arrested for underage alcohol. These subjects were drinking on grounds but it could not be determined if they had obtained their alcohol from an on-site vendor or not. One was in the possession of a mixed drink at the time of her arrest.

Arrest Information off grounds/downtown:

Arrests/incidents in the downtown and near Recreation Park included Battery, Disorderly Conduct, Theft, Property Damage, Open Intoxicants and Public Urination.

Additional Information:

Each night after the second session of the pull is completed we experience a large number of patrons in the downtown area. The taverns in the downtown draw large crowds after the pulls. At least two of taverns had special events starting after the pulls were done including Jell-O wrestling and a Tug-of-War competition. Several locations had standing room only and lines waiting outside to get in. At bar closing time there were several hundred people out on the sidewalks.

I attended a meeting of the Our Town Tomah group.

I assisted the Rotary Club of Tomah at the "Battle of the Choirs".

I conducted an Administrative Staff meeting.

OPERATIONS LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of June, 2011 by Lieutenant Mark Nicholson:

Completed requests made by the City Attorney's Office and the District Attorney's office for copies of evidence related to audio, video and pictures.

Conducted shift supervisor activities on many of my regularly scheduled shifts.

Monitored and processed incoming temporary evidence, assuring that it was properly packaged and labeled. Once this was completed the evidence was processed into the evidence room.

Managed and processed the open records requests for audio and video related evidence.

Managed all schedule related issues for all sworn department members. This task included schedule variations related to comp time, vacation time, court time, training time, sick leave, and special assignments.

Assumed command of the Department while Chief Revels was out of town attending training.

Represented the Department for the Grand National Tractor Pull Association's media relations event.

Attended a Probationary Review Board meeting to discuss the status of Officer Helgerson as she neared the end of her review period.

I assumed the duties of Officer-In-Charge for an incident involving a vehicle which may have contained explosives. During this incident, a four block area including Superior, McLean and Kilbourn Avenues was secured while the Dane County Ordnance Disposal Unit searched the vehicle. This incident required a coordinated effort between the Tomah Police Department, Monroe County Sheriff's Department, Tomah Fire Department, Tomah Area Ambulance, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, Federal Bureau of Investigations, Dane County Ordnance Disposal Unit, and the Fort McCoy Fire Department.

SUPPORT SERVICES LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of June, 2011 by Lieutenant Ron Waddell:

Conducted Shift Supervisor duties on many of my scheduled shifts.

Monitored and processed incoming temporary evidence assuring proper packaging and identification was affixed.

Facilitated the scheduling of all training related events for department staff.

Currently reviewing and making necessary changes to several departmental Policies and Procedures.

Spoke with new officer candidates prior to them testing at the department on June 11, 2011. This included providing information related the expectations of a new officer, staffing at the department, benefits, equipment, community programs, and much more.

Assisted Sgt. Huneck with fleet maintenance related issues (i.e. scheduling oil changes, following through with repairs on items reported by staff).

Responded to multiple calls for service and conducted subsequent investigations.

COMBINED TACTICAL UNIT

Call Out: June 14, 2011:

Monroe County Sheriff's Department requested CTU respond to assist with an armed and possibly suicidal subject at a residence in Oakdale. CTU call out was initiated and the subject left the residence during the CTU response and was apprehended by on-scene personnel after he left the area in a vehicle.

Training: June 1, 2011:

Training was held at the Monroe County Range and consisted of zeroing weapons and working on vehicle takedown SOP. Sgt. Ames made arrangements for two cars to be at the range for use during the training and we also conducted test firing of pistol and rifle through the windshield, from the inside out. We determined that both TPD pistol and rifle duty ammunition was reasonably accurate when fired through the windshield at a target. We did not have a means available to test the retained terminal ballistic capability of the projectiles that did strike the target. Training concluded with a live fire full speed sniper initiated hostage rescue vehicle takedown.

June 15, 2011:

Training was held at the Sparta Police Department and Monroe County Range and was conducted by Officer Guraiki and Officer Jones. Training consisted of an overview of the role of the sniper and sniper equipment. Training then moved to the Monroe County range where we practiced some camouflaging techniques and woods movements.

TRAINING

Chief Revels attended the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration Summit.

Administrative Assistant Culpitt attended the Law Enforcement Administrative Professionals conference.

CRIME PREVENTION/COMMUNITY RELATIONS

The Department assisted the Jesse Parker Foundation with their annual event.

The Department assisted with the July 4th parade.

Chief Revels attended an Ice Cream Social held by the Heeler/Grandview Neighborhood Watch.

Officer Marshall and Sgt. Huneck are working with the Boys and Girls Club on the Gang Resistance and Education Training Summer Program (G.R.E.A.T.). A schedule of events is included in this report.

The Boys and Girls Club Torch group assisted in flower bed and landscaping maintenance at the police department.

Administrative Assistant Culpitt participated in the One Accord/Rotary sponsored "Battle of the Choirs".

INVESTIGATIONS

[Numerous Case numbers] Adult Selling Alcohol to Minor-1st

The Tomah Police Department conducted alcohol compliance checks with each of the licensed City of Tomah liquor license establishments. The following locations/establishments failed the compliance check and were subsequently cited for the violation.

Bud's Ball Park, Breakroom Bar, Crow Bar, EconoLodge, Bank Tavern, Casey's General Store, Kwik Trip South, Tomah Mini-Mart, Burnstad's Market, Kwik Trip North, Casey's Spirit Shop, AmericInn, Four Star Family Restaurant, Pizza Hut
Brahma's bar, Dimension's Bar, Strike Zone, Elbow Room Bar, Lark Inn General Store and the Cranberry Country Lodge.

[11-1129] Disorderly Conduct (Municipal), Resisting an Officer, Disorderly Conduct

Tomah Officers were at the Tractor Pull and were informed by Security that there was a male subject who was being disorderly. Officers had contact with the male subject and asked him to leave the grandstand area. The subject began leaving the grandstand area and then attempted to walk away from the officers. The subject was instructed numerous times to stop but refused. Officers attempted to secure the subject in handcuffs but he resisted and was stabilized against a building. The subject was cited and released. Upon being released the subject began threatening Officers and screaming profanities. The subject's friends attempted to escort him off the premises but the male subject continued to yell and create a disturbance. The subject was completely out of control and was taken into custody a second time. The subject resisted arrest and was controlled by an electronic control device. The subject was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

[11-1136] Urinating in Public/Disorderly Conduct

Tomah Officers contacted a subject on the 1200 block of Superior Avenue for Urinating in Public. The subject was cited and released. Upon being released the male subject began yelling profanities at the Police. This was at bar closing time and there were approximately 100 patrons on the sidewalks and in the street. The subject continued to yell and create a disturbance. The subject was taken into custody a second time and was ultimately cited for Disorderly Conduct. The subject apologized for his behavior and was released.

[11-1140] Underage Possession/Consuming Alcohol

Tomah Officers were contacted by the Tractor Pull Security personnel to investigate a possible underage alcohol violation involving two subjects. The Officers determined a

male and a female were underage and had been consuming alcohol. Both subjects were cited and released. During the contact two subjects approached and indicated they were friends of the male underage subject. These two friends were also underage and had been consuming alcohol. These two subjects were cited and released.

[11-1141] Open Intoxicant's on Street/Warrant

Tomah Officers had contact with a male subject that was consuming an alcoholic beverage on the sidewalk on the 1100 block of Superior Avenue. Officers determined the subject had a warrant from the Tomah Police Department. The subject was able to post the bond for the warrant. The subject was cited and released.

[11-1149] Disorderly Conduct/Probation Violation

Tomah Officers were dispatched to the area of 1500 Lincoln Avenue for a reported disturbance. Officers arrived and met with an intoxicated female subject that had been yelling and pounding on people's doors. This female subject was cited for Disorderly Conduct. The female submitted to a Preliminary Breath Test and the result was .261. The female is currently on probation and probation placed a hold on her. The female was transported to the Monroe County Jail.
