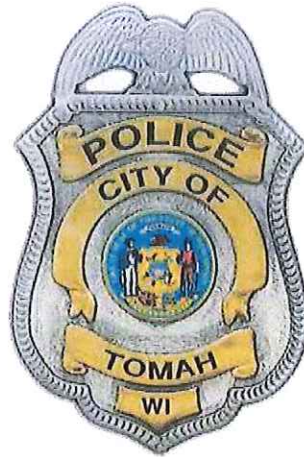

June 2016 Report

CHIEF'S ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of June 2016:

I attended bi-weekly meetings with other City of Tomah Department Supervisors.

As a board member of the Tomah Area Boys and Girls Club I attended board meetings and subcommittee meetings related to this organization.

I attended Administrative Staff meetings with members of the Tomah Police Department.

I met with Greg Hagen to provide a Community Update interview.

I attended the Northwood's Coalition Training Conference. The Northwood's Coalition Represents 37 counties and 11 Wisconsin Tribal Nations. The Coalition helps shape policies, best practices and programs which address public health issues arising from the use of alcohol and other drugs through training, education, and technical assistance. While at the conference the City of Tomah received a Commendation Award for the work that the Ad Hoc Alcohol Committee did.

I attended the Tomah Tractor Pull Press Release Luncheon. The Tomah Police Department staffed officers at the event throughout the weekend.

I attended a meeting to discuss changes to and issues with the changes made in Monroe County related to the mental health commitment process. The meeting was attended by representatives from the Tomah Police Department, Sparta Police Department, Monroe County Sheriff's Department, Tomah Memorial Hospital, Monroe County Health Department, and Northwest Connections.

OPERATIONS LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of June 2016 by Lieutenant Ron Waddell:

All scheduling responsibilities (time off, overtime, special events, etc.).

Facilitated responsibilities as a Time Agency Co- Coordinator (TAC), scheduling on-line recertification and conducting expiration audits. Task is shared with Lt. Scott Holum.

Many of my shifts require a dual role, working as shift supervisor and completing administrative responsibilities.

Provide assistance as needed with incoming temporary evidence as needed. The evidence responsibilities may require return of evidence and limited destruction of evidence as time permitted. Evidence is provided to officers for follow-up and/or turn over to other police agencies.

Review of all "Use of Force Reports".

Received, processed, and scheduled all "Ride Along Request" forms that were approved for civilians.

I represented the City of Tomah Police Department at the County Incident Command for the June 6 – 9 Miles Paratus Exercise. This was an exercise designed to test all areas of emergency management resources available in the state.

SUPPORT SERVICES LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out by Lieutenant Scott Holum in June of 2016:

I conducted Shift Supervisor responsibilities on some of my shifts.

I facilitated an unfunded Click It or Ticket grant through the Wisconsin Department of Transportation. This mobilization began on May 23rd and ended on June 5th. The mobilization resulted in 251 traffic stops, 278 written warnings, 180 traffic citations, 6 drug arrests, 4 felony arrests, 13 misdemeanor arrests, and 3 warrant arrests.

I monitored the Prescription Drug Box in the front lobby of the Police Department.

I participated in the patrol officer hiring process. The department is currently conducting a background investigation on Kenneth Foster from Holmen, WI.

I attended a Tomah Police Department Administrative Staff meeting.

Sergeant Preuss and I processed all incoming evidence and facilitated requests for evidence release/copies from the District Attorney's Office.

I continued to research cases and purge property in the evidence storage area.

I commanded the Field Training program that is supervised by Sergeant Pedersen. Officer Rylan Corcoran and Officer Brandon Kuhn are both currently in Step V (Solo patrol).

I provided oversight to Sergeant Huneck and Sergeant Jones concerning the Fleet Maintenance program with scheduled and unscheduled repairs.

I assisted Lt. Waddell in scheduling related matters.

I performed the duties as the department's Time Agency Coordinator (TAC).

TRAINING REVIEW:

Monroe County Combined Tactical Unit participated in one and one half days of the Miles Paratus disaster preparedness exercise at Fort McCoy. During the exercise we had the opportunity to partner with several other SWAT units to complete several missions. On June 6th the overall exercise at Fort McCoy was taking place in Tomah and surrounding Monroe County. For our portion of the exercise we were required to conduct a rescue of an injured officer in a hostile environment and then partner with five other SWAT teams to search for and detain suspects who had fired shots at and injured the deputy in both residential and rural settings. On June 9th we partnered with Milwaukee County Sheriff's Department SWAT team to apprehend suspects barricaded in two separate buildings across the street from one another. The exercise provided us with the opportunity to test our protocols and to also practice partnering with SWAT teams from around the state to handle a complex and wide area scenario.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

INVESTIGATIONS

[16-0898] Disorderly Conduct-Alcohol related, Disorderly Conduct-Physical, Criminal Damage to Property

Tomah officers responded to the area behind the Bank Bar for a report of a disturbance involving approximately 12 people and a subject was now breaking windows out of a business located near the alley. Officers arrived and met with several involved subjects. One of the subjects admitted to breaking the windows out of anger. This subject and two others were cited and released. All subjects had been consuming alcohol.

[16-0948] Possession of Methamphetamine, Possession of Methamphetamine Paraphernalia, Bail Jumping, Probation Hold

A Tomah officer conducted a traffic stop for an equipment violation. The Monroe County Sheriff's Department Canine and Handler were requested to conduct an exterior sniff of the vehicle. Probable cause was established to conduct a warrantless search of the vehicle and methamphetamine and paraphernalia were located. The operator of the vehicle was arrested and transported to the Monroe County Jail.

[16-0987] Marijuana Delivery, Marijuana Possession w/ Intent, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Possession of Marijuana-Felony

Tomah officers responded to the area behind the Bank Bar for a complaint of numerous people smoking marijuana. Officers had contact with three adult males. One of the males was in the act of lighting a 'bowl' and attempted to hide the pipe. Officers determined all three subjects had been smoking marijuana. Subsequently, a search was conducted and several individually packaged bags of marijuana were located along with a sum of money. Two subjects had charges referred to the Monroe County District Attorney.
