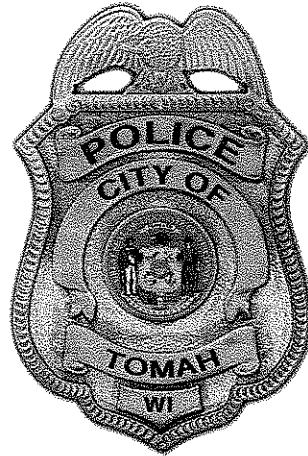

POLICE CHIEF WES REVELS

CHIEF'S ACTIVITIES:

I attended the Committee of the Whole meeting and the Common Council meeting in May.

I attended a meeting of the Monroe County Safety Coalition.

The Department Awards Banquet was held in May during National Law Enforcement Week.

Representatives from the Department and District Attorney's Office met with the family of Vance Evans. Mr. Evans was the victim in an ongoing death investigation.

As Chairperson of the Coulee Region Law Enforcement Executive Group I lead the meeting in May.

I met with Principal Sulik from St. Mary's Elementary School regarding the G.R.E.A.T program.

I conducted a staff meeting in May.

Administrative Assistant Culpitt and I met with Police Clerk Pat Morris regarding her plans to retire.

OPERATIONS LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

TRAINING

Chief Revels attended the second week of a three week program titled, "Leadership in Police Organizations".

Lieutenant Nicholson and Administrative Assistant Culpitt were trained on the new Enterprise software for our Records Management System.

We conducted Department wide training in May. We received information from Major Joe Adamson and Mr. Jeff Unger regarding Veterans returning from Iraq and Afghanistan. Sergeant Weaver provided instruction on off-duty responsibilities and Sergeant Preuss provided instruction on felony vehicle stops.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

Officer Marshall investigated a disorderly conduct incident at Tomah Middle School where one student hit another student. One student was cited municipally and the second student was referred to Monroe County Human Services.

Officer Marshall received a Quick 50 tip that led to a student being charged with possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia.

A Tomah Senior High student charged with theft for stealing wire from the metals class that was later sold as scrap.

One of the Tomah Senior High students was found in possession of a knife.

A Tomah Middle School student was referred to MCHS for theft after taking a laptop computer that belonged to a staff member. The computer was recovered.

Three Tomah Middle School students were cited for damage to property and inappropriate behaviors in the locker room at the Tomah Middle School.

I appeared on WBOG's Morning Mix radio program. I spoke about pedestrian safety and graduation activities.

Sergeant Pedersen and I were interviewed by Greg Hagen. The topic of discussion was the Geographical Assignment Initiative. Sergeant Pedersen has supervisory responsibility for the initiative.

I assisted Todd Stark, the lead organizer of the Memorial Day Car Show. My responsibility was to pick out my favorite entry and to present the Chief's plaque to the selection.

Officer Marshall and I assisted with the Community Pride Program at McDonald's.

I attended a meeting of the Grandview/Heeler Neighborhood Watch.

As a representative of Our Town Tomah I delivered pizza to the members of Roots and Shoots at the Tomah Senior High. This was a thank you from Our Town Tomah to the student for their help with the downtown cleanup.

Members of the Department participated in Project Wisdom at the Tomah Middle School.

INVESTIGATIONS

[10-0910] OMVWI-2nd/ Resisting an Officer/Bailjumping (Felony)/Operating After Revocation-OWI related/Reckless Driving

Tomah Police were dispatched to the 1300 block of Superior Ave. for a reported crash. A plain clothed Tomah Officer arrived first and was directed towards a subject that was staggering away from the scene. This subject was the vehicle operator and began to try and hit/punch a couple citizens. The subject was stabilized against the ground until uniformed Officers were on scene. The subject was intoxicated and had veered onto the sidewalk, crashed through a light pole and came to rest after crashing into two parked vehicles. The subject was taken to Tomah Memorial Hospital for a legal blood draw and then was transported to another hospital for extended medical treatment.

[10-0943] Use/Abuse of Hazardous Substance/Numerous Traffic Citations

Tomah Officers were dispatched to the 400 block of N. Glendale Ave. for a reported motor vehicle crash. Additional information was that two occupants from the vehicle had fled on foot prior to Police arrival. Officers were able to determine who fled from the

vehicle and they were soon located and interviewed. Both subjects admitted to “huffing” keyboard duster (Compressed air in a can) prior to the crash. Both subjects were taken to the Monroe County Jail.

[10-0956] Agency Assist

Tomah Officers assisted with a low speed traffic pursuit involving a semi-tractor and trailer. The semi was traveling into oncoming traffic and had swerved at a Police vehicle. The pursuit culminated on the west side of the City of Sparta. The Tomah Police Department Combined Tactical Unit members were activated to assist with the arrest of the vehicle operator. The La Crosse County Bearcat was utilized to affect the safe arrest of the vehicle operator.

[10-1040] Underage Alcohol/Probation Hold

A Tomah Office had finished his tour of duty and was leaving the City of Tomah on his personally owned vehicle. The Officer was flagged down by a male subject who was crying and intoxicated. The subject recognized the Officer and commented that he just broke up with his girlfriend and wanted to go to jail. The subject is currently on Probation with provisions that he shall not consume alcohol. The subject was taken into custody on the Probation hold and taken to Jail.

[10-1105] Possession of Cocaine w/ Intent/Possession of Cocaine/Warrant arrest

A Tomah Officer observed a subject in the downtown bar district acting suspiciously. The subject attempted to flee from the Officer but was contacted outside the front of Dimensions Bar. When the subject finally stopped he discarded an item from his pants pocket onto the ground. The item the subject threw was determined to be crack cocaine and cocaine powder. The subject was taken to the Monroe County Jail and released.
