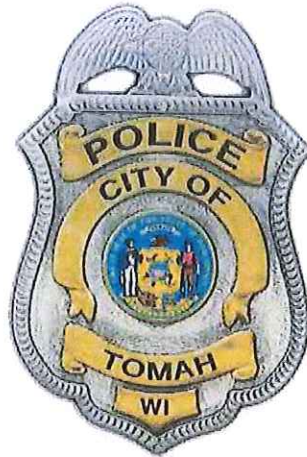

May 2014 Report

CHIEF'S ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of May 2014:

I assisted in the weekly monitoring of the Prescription Drug Drop Off Box located in the lobby of the Tomah Police Department.

I attended an employee meeting at Callahan's Pub. The meeting was attended by the owner, several licensed operators employed by Callahan's, and Alder Greeno. During the meeting we had an opportunity to discuss any issues which they had and reiterated the importance of checking ID's to ensure that underage persons weren't being served.

I assisted in the facilitation of the departments Social Media Networks to include Facebook and Twitter.

I attended a three (3) hour training session sponsored by the Wisconsin League of Municipalities related to Alcohol licensing, regulations, and ordinances. The presenters included Attorney Rick Stadelman, Wisconsin Towns Association; Attorney Claire Silverman, League of Wisconsin Municipalities; and Roger Johnson, Wisconsin Department of Revenue. City Clerk JoAnn Cram and Stephanie Rowell attended the training with me.

I facilitated a Department Command Staff meeting at the Tomah Police Department.

I attended a meeting with CenturyLink to discuss and review a new phone system that the Police Department and City Hall departments may be looking at purchasing/leasing in 2015.

I attended a meeting at the request of Monroe County District Attorney Kevin Chroninger. The meeting was to discuss the possibility of participating in a county-wide drug task force. The meeting was attended by administrative personnel from the Tomah Police Department, Sparta Police Department, Monroe County Sheriff's Department and DA Chroninger.

I attended a monthly Our Town Tomah meeting held in the police departments Community Room.

I participated and assisted in the Downtown Tomah cleanup project that is held annually.

Several members of our department, including myself, assisted in the construction of the Burnstad's Adventure Park.

May 11 to May 17 was National Peace Officer's Memorial Week. In honor of this I facilitated our annual Awards Ceremony luncheon held at the Tomah Police Department. Awards were presented to officers, former non-sworn staff, and civilians for incidents or actions that occurred during 2013.

I attended the Committee of the Whole meeting. I also attended a special City Council meeting to further discuss Alcohol and Operators licenses.

I attended a Monroe County Justice Coordinators meeting.

I attended bi-weekly meetings with other Department Supervisors.

I attended a Police and Fire Commission meeting to discuss the current job openings to include the Sergeant and Patrol Officer hiring processes.

I attended a Public Works Committee meeting to discuss the overnight parking ordinance that had been previously presented to the City Council.

I attended the Monroe County Safe Community Coalition, Alcohol Safety sub-group meeting

OPERATIONS LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of May 2014 by Lieutenant Ron Waddell:

All scheduling responsibilities (time off, overtime, special events, etc.) for sworn personnel.

Facilitated responsibilities as the Time Agency Coordinator (TAC), scheduling on-line recertification and conducting expiration audits.

I conducted shift supervisor activities on many of my regularly scheduled shifts and was available for incident command/high risk calls.

I assist with incoming temporary evidence as needed. The evidence responsibilities also required return of evidence and limited destruction of evidence as time permitted. Evidence was provided to officers for follow-up and/or turn over to other police agencies.

Hosted a Financial Institution Security Officers Association (F.I.S.O.A.) meeting in the police department's multi-purpose room. The agenda covered topics such as current scams being reported to the police department and the scams observed by the institutions. Plans for a fall Citizens Police Academy class continue. The institutions are proposing to cooperatively sponsor the class with donated funds.

On May 8 I was among other department members that participated in weapon qualification training. This included qualifying with duty pistol, off-duty pistol, and M-4 rifle.

On May 19 I, along with Lt Holum, Sgt Pedersen, and Officer Hintz, conducted interviews for entry level patrol. Seven candidates were interviewed, with four being recommended for advancement to interview with the Police and Fire Commission.

I was a very proud attendee at the Tomah Police Department Award Ceremony on May 14, 2014.

On May 29, 2014 Lt. Holum and I attended training for a new Training Records Management program the State Training and Standards Board will be implementing July 1, 2014.

SUPPORT SERVICES LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out by Lieutenant Scott Holum in May 2014:

I conducted Shift Supervisor responsibilities on most of my shifts.

I monitored the Prescription Drug Box in the front lobby of the police department.

I continued purging evidence items from the evidence storage area for destruction.

I monitored and processed incoming temporary evidence as needed. Lieutenant Waddell and Sergeant Preuss assist with this as well.

I provided oversight to Sergeant Huneck concerning the Fleet Maintenance program with scheduled and unscheduled repairs. An inventory of all sensitive items was generated.

I scheduled officers for training throughout Wisconsin to meet the needs of the individual officer and the department.

I attended the department for Spring firearms qualification.

I administered the Physical Agility Test at the Tomah High School to patrol officer candidates.

I continued to coordinate the Uniform Allowance program for each sworn member of the police department.

I transported purged evidence to a facility in LaCrosse to be destroyed in a blast furnace.

I conducted patrol officer interviews along with Lieutenant Waddell, Sergeant Pedersen and Officer Hintz.

I conducted an inventory of department ammunition and followed up with distributors about orders placed from 2013.

I am working on a Memorandum of Understanding with the Monroe County District Attorney's Office concerning the destruction of evidence.

I am conducting research on a web-based program known as Nixle to send automated emails and text messages to citizens that sign up for the service.

I attended training in Fennimore, Wisconsin administered by the Wisconsin Department of Justice – Training and Standards Bureau related to new online certification of sworn personnel.

COMBINED TACTICAL UNIT

TOMAH POLICE DEPARTMENT TACTICAL CALL OUT:

None to report.

COMBINED TACTICAL UNIT CALL OUT:

05/30/14: River Road, Sparta. Barricaded Subject. Sparta Police Department requested Combined Tactical Unit to respond to a report of a subject who was intoxicated and threatened to load his guns, shoot his family and responding police before killing himself. CTU responded and established inner perimeter positions around the residence. The newly acquired MRAP (armored vehicle) was deployed in front of the residence as mobile cover for the tactical personnel covering the front side. A tactical team member at the rear of the residence observed the subject armed with a long gun peeking out a window. In order to provide mobile cover for the tactical personnel in the rear of the residence the La Crosse County Sheriff's Department BEARCAT (armored vehicle) was requested and responded. Numerous attempts to communicate with the subject were unsuccessful and Flashbangs were deployed in the back yard and front yard as a probing technique and still there was no response from the suspect. OC (pepper spray) munitions were fired into the residence and the subject exited. The subject was still non-compliant, but after being struck with several less-lethal projectiles he went to the ground and was secured. A CTU tactical medic began evaluating the subject and Sparta Ambulance arrived and took over treatment, eventually transporting the subject to Mayo Clinic-Sparta for treatment before Sparta Police booked him at the Monroe County Jail.

TRAINING:

Jackson County Sheriff's Department Emergency Response Team (ERT) requested CTU assistance with two demonstrations for the Badger State Sheriff's Convention in Black River Falls. This provided a unique opportunity to assistance with the conference and providing our team members with some quality training in the process, including interacting with Jackson County Sheriff ERT, Wisconsin State Patrol airplane and Wisconsin Department of Justice-Division of Criminal Investigation personnel. Two

rural manhunt operations were conducted twice during the day. First, Monroe County CTU served as a quick reaction force and responded via La Crosse County Sheriff's Department BEARCAT to a structure where a Wisconsin State Patrol airplane had observed a suspect fleeing. Included in this portion of the exercise was an "officer down rescue." However, our personnel never presented an opportunity for the role player to inflict any simulated injury to our officers who quickly established a perimeter around the structure. The suspect eventually fled the structure while armed and was shot by officers on the perimeter. The second scenario consisted of a woodland K-9 track for a suspect from a vehicle. Our team covertly deployed and then Tomah Police Department K-9 Jager quickly located the track and began following the trail. One of our tactical team members saw the suspect in the distance and K-9 Jager was released off-leash to apprehend the suspect when he failed to comply with officers commands. K-9 Jager held the suspect while tactical team personnel approached and took the suspect into custody.

INVESTIGATIONS

[14-0646] Recklessly Endangering Safety, Criminal Damage to Property, Disorderly Conduct

Tomah officers responded to the area near the Greyhound Depot for a report of a male subject throwing large rocks at vehicles and a bus. Officers learned the suspect was being physically detained by two citizens. Officers arrived and took the subject into custody. The subject had thrown a large rock at the large side window of a bus causing it to crack but thankfully not break as there were passengers on the bus. The subject was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

[14-0662] Disorderly Conduct – Alcohol/Physical

A Tomah officer was patrolling the downtown bar district and observed a physical altercation taking place near a cab. The officer learned a male subject was upset with another and punched him as he was seated in the cab. The subject was intoxicated. The subject was cited and released.

[14-0670] Violation of Closing Hours, Disorderly Conduct, Bail Jumping, Possession of Marijuana and Possession of Paraphernalia

Tomah officers conducted a bar check at Callahan's Bar after observing the band playing and patrons still inside near closing time. Officers parked and verified the current time both with Dispatch and cellular phone and confirmed the time was 2:30AM. Officers entered and observed approximately twenty people inside the bar. Once officers were inside the bar, the bar tender began to tell people they needed to leave. Officers informed the bartender that he would be receiving a citation. The bartender then began to curse repeatedly, raise his voice and create a disturbance. The bartender was arrested and escorted to a squad car. The bartender admitted to possessing marijuana and 'bowl.' The bartender is on bond through Monroe County with restrictions on consuming alcohol. The bartender admitted to consuming alcohol and submitted to a Preliminary Breath Test with a result of .06 BAC. The bartender was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

[14-0720] Bail Jumping-Misdemeanor, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Operating After Revocation-OWI

A Tomah officer conducted a traffic stop after observing the female operator and having prior knowledge that she was not valid. The female operator is currently on four (4) sets of Monroe County bond conditions. The female is prohibited from operating a motor vehicle unless properly license. The female operator is currently revoked due to an OWI conviction. The female is a known chronic abuser of opiates and was found to have a syringe in her possession. The female subject was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

[14-0727] Disorderly Conduct, Battery, Criminal Damage to Property

A Tomah officer was on patrol in the downtown bar district. The officer turned onto East Juneau Street and interrupted a disturbance that was taking place in the middle of the street. A male subject had punched and broken a window on a vehicle and when ordered to stop by the police began to flee. The subject was located in the beer garden behind Callahan's Bar. The subject was taken into custody and transported to the Monroe County Jail.

[14-0728] Combined Tactical Unit Call-out

The Monroe County Combined Tactical Unit was alerted and responded to an address in the City of Sparta for a suicidal armed subject. Earlier this same day, the Tomah Police

Department took receipt of a Government surplus armored vehicle that was funded by the three agencies that comprise the Combined Tactical Unit (City of Tomah, City of Sparta and the Monroe County Sheriff's Department). This vehicle was brought to the scene and permitted tactical personnel to be safely contained inside while the vehicle was positioned in the front yard of the suspect's residence. The armored vehicle was used to provide lighting and ballistic protection for many law enforcement personnel during this operation. A second armored vehicle, La Crosse County's BEARCAT, was also used during this operation. The suspect was ultimately taken into custody without incident. The armored vehicles were invaluable and significantly aided the efficient and peaceful resolution to this dangerous situation.
