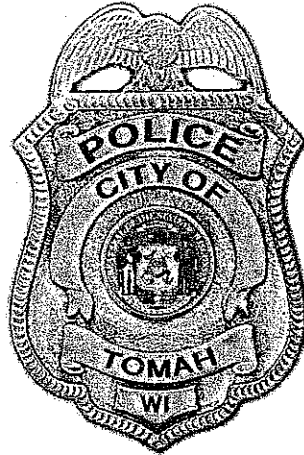


# **TOMAH POLICE DEPARTMENT**

**NOVEMBER 2009 REPORT**

**POLICE CHIEF WES REVELS**

### CHIEF'S ACTIVITIES:

I attended the weekly the Department Head staff meetings on November 3, 10, and 17. The staff meeting scheduled for November 24 was cancelled.

I attended the Committee as a Whole meeting.

I conducted an Administrative Staff meeting on November 10.

I was on vacation from November 2 to November 6.

The Dog Ordinance work group continues to make progress. The process of reviewing the current ordinances is nearing completion. The next stage of the process will be to discuss areas that are in need of additional language. The focus of any additional language will emphasize responsible pet ownership and commonly regulated behaviors.

I attended a meeting of the Coulee Region Executive Police Group. This month the group was given a presentation by the Director of Lawyer Regulation. The Director provided an overview of the complaint process related to the law profession to include his responsibilities and how complaints are processed in the Department of Regulation and Licensing. In 2010, I assumed the responsibilities of Chairperson for the Coulee Region Executive Police Group.

I met with one of the employees regarding a personnel matter.

I met with Attorney Berry and Administrator Bialecki, together with representatives of AFSCME, regarding the Department Cleaning Services.

I met with the Local Emergency Planning Committee. Cindy Struve, the Emergency Management Coordinator, updated the group on changes to the response plan.

I met with Heather Gartner to discuss an underage alcohol use reduction program titled, "Parents Who Host Lose the Most".

I assisted with the November Community Pride program. The Community Pride program involves meeting with high school students for the purpose of discussing concerns that they may have about issues related to the school, community and/or police department. We discuss things such as drug use, bullying, harassment, parking, school safety, littering and many other topics.

Filled video evidence requests from the DA.

Managed all schedule related issues to include Patrol and Supervisor picks for 2010.

### CRIME PREVENTION/COMMUNITY RELATIONS

I attended the weekly Rotary meetings.

I participated in a fundraising event sponsored by students from the Tomah Senior Ceramics Class. The proceeds of the fundraiser went to the Food Pantry.

I met with members of Rotary Interact.

I met with Paul Medinger from the Tomah Journal. Paul assisted the Department in authoring an article on the topic of "Sexting" or sometimes known as "self portrait pornography".

I assisted with the City employee sponsored Community Dinner on November 23 at the Masonic Temple.

### INVESTIGATIONS

#### **[Case #09-2264] Possession of a Prescription Drug w/o a Prescription**

Officers were requested by Probation and Parole to assist with security while Probation and Parole did a search of the portion of the residence their client had control over. Officers then obtained consent from another subject living at this residence to search their bedroom. Prescription pills were located but neither subject had a prescription for the pills. Both subjects were arrested for Possessing a Prescription Drug without a Prescription.

#### **[Case #09-2289] Battery and Disorderly Conduct**

Officers were sent to a residence in the city for a fight that had occurred. It was determined that a male and female had gotten into a physical altercation in which the female had gotten struck and shoved into a vehicle. The male was cited for Battery and Disorderly Conduct.

#### **[Case #09-2292] Theft by Fraud**

A male subject came to the police department to report a Theft by Fraud Complaint. The male met a female on a dating website and began chatting with her on the Internet. The male sent approximately \$10,000 to the female with the intent to have the female move to Tomah and eventually be married. The investigation revealed that the female did not use her real name and had no intention of ever moving to Tomah. The female's true identity was not identified in this case.

#### **[Case #09-2294] Exposing Child to Harmful Material**

Officers assisted with a drug search warrant in Camp Douglas. During the search warrant, a telephone was seized and a search warrant was granted to search the phone. During the search of

the phone, several inappropriate pictures were located and it was determined these were being sent to a juvenile female. This case is still under investigation.

**[Case #09-2296] Felony Intimidation of a Witness**

A male subject came to the police department to report that he was being harassed as a result of testifying in another criminal matter. The male was walking along Superior Ave and observed a suspicious vehicle in the area. The vehicle stopped near the male and another male got out of the vehicle. The male from the vehicle threatened to beat up the other male for "snitching" in another case. There was no physical confrontation between the two males and one male was arrested for Felony Intimidation of a Witness and Bailjumping.

**[Case #09-2311] Fatal Crash**

Officers were sent to the intersection of East Clifton Street and Sime Avenue for a semi versus vehicle crash. Upon arrival, it was determined that there was a fatality as a result of the crash. An on-scene investigation was conducted with the assistance of the Wisconsin State Patrol. This case is still under investigation.

**[Case #09-2324] Arson Other Than Building**

Officers of the Tomah Police Department and the Tomah Fire Department were dispatched near the observation tower on the walking path for an uncontrolled fire. Upon the fire departments arrival, they observed three juvenile subjects, covered in soot, attempting to extinguish the fire. One subject was later arrested for Arson and Negligent Handling of Burning Materials.

**[Case #09-2348] Bomb Threat**

Officers were dispatched to Pizza Hut for a Bomb Threat. The caller spoke in an Arabic voice and indicated that they had a bomb and that there was a bomb. The phone number of where the call came from was obtained. A subpoena was granted to identify the owner of the phone number used to make the call. A subject admitted to making the phone call and was cited for Unlawful Use of a Telephone.

**[Case #09-2408] Disarming a Peace Officer-Attempted**

Tomah Police Department received information from Monroe County Communications Center that a subject was in Brahmas Bar in violation of Probation & Parole Rules. This subject was located in the bar and Probation & Parole was contacted. Probation & Parole advised that the subject should be arrested for violation of his probation conditions. This subject was allowed to smoke a cigarette, but the refused to put the cigarette out once the decision to arrest him was made. This subject struggled while being handcuffed and during a search of his person at the squad car. During the struggle carrier grabbed the handle of Sgt. Weaver's TASER in an apparent attempt to remove the TASER from its holster. This subject was arrested for Disarming a Peace Officer-Attempted, Resisting Arrest and a Probation and Parole Hold and transported to the Monroe County Jail.

**[Case #09-2326] Knowingly Fleeing an Officer**

Officer Jones was on patrol and tracked a vehicle traveling 58 mph in a 25 mph zone on East Monowau Street. Officer Jones activated his lights and siren in an attempt to get the driver to stop but instead the driver sped up. The vehicle eventually stopped in the 700 block of Farmer Avenue and Officer Jones made contact with the driver. The driver began to walk towards the residence and ignored Officer Jones's commands for the driver to stop. Officer Jones deployed his Taser and officers were eventually able to gain control of the driver. The driver was arrested for Knowingly Fleeing an Officer, OMVWI-2nd and above, Resisting Arrest, Obstructing,

Operating a Motor Vehicle with a Prohibited Alcohol Concentration and Speeding and taken to jail.

### COMMENDATIONS

I wish to take this opportunity to acknowledge the professional work that the Police Officers, Emergency Medical Technicians and Firefighters accomplished during the traffic fatality that happened at the intersection of Sime Avenue and Clifton Street. Tragedies of this magnitude affect many people; family, friends, police officers, emergency medical technicians, firefighters and many others. We must never forget how quickly our lives can change and the impact that these tragedies have on the first responders who are called upon to work through a crisis of this nature. By all accounts, the police officers, emergency medical technicians and firefighters worked together to manage the traffic fatality in a professional and caring manner. My sympathy goes out to the Tobin family and their friends. My thanks go out to the first responders for the work they do.
