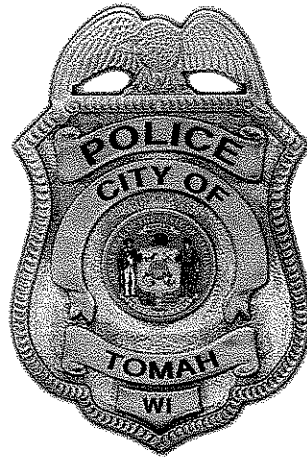

**POLICE CHIEF WES REVELS**

## **CHIEF'S ACTIVITIES**

I attended a meeting of the Monroe County Safety Coalition.

I attended the Department Head staff meetings with the Mayor and City Administrator.

I conducted an Administrative Staff meeting.

I conducted a Command Staff meeting.

Lieutenant Nicholson and I attended a planning session for Patriot 2012.

I attended an Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse meeting at the Sparta School District Administrative Center. The Sparta School District no longer has the funds to support their ADOA position. We are currently exploring ways to continue some of the programming without a person available to coordinate the activities.

I met with Natalie Carlisle from the Monroe County Safety Coalition for the purpose of discussing a Community Forum to be held in Tomah. Plans are to organize a Community Forum for the purpose of drawing a greater awareness to the community related to heroin use, prescription drug abuse and information related to past narcotics investigations in the City of Tomah.

## **OPERATIONS LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES**

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of November, 2011 by Lieutenant Mark Nicholson:

Completed requests made by the City Attorney's Office and the District Attorney's office for copies of evidence related to audio, video and pictures.

Attended Administrative and Command Staff meetings held at the Tomah Police Department.

Attended Municipal Court as the Court Officer.

Conducted shift supervisor activities on many of my regularly scheduled shifts.

Monitored and processed incoming temporary evidence, assuring that it was properly packaged and labeled. Once this was completed the evidence was processed into the evidence room.

Managed and processed the open records requests for audio and video related evidence.

Managed all schedule related issues for all sworn department members. This task included schedule variations related to comp time, vacation time, court time, training time, sick leave and special assignments.

Prepared the 2012 schedule for the sergeants and patrol officers. This included shift schedules, shift assignments and the vacation selection process.

Attended meetings held by the Tomah Chamber of Commerce, the Tomah Lions Club, and the Tomah Area Ambulance Service. During the meetings information regarding the Carry Concealed Weapons law and the Open Carry law were discussed.

Attended meetings with the Monroe County Sheriff's Department and the Sparta Police Department to discuss joint operations.

Attended a meeting at Volk Field to gather information about the upcoming Patriot 2012 exercise.

Reviewed, prepared, and revised policies in anticipation of the 2012 policy review process.

Implemented the Network Fleet program/software. The Network Fleet program is an internet based program with a GPS unit attached to the squad cars. The two primary functions of this program are fuel economy and time management/accountability.

### **SUPPORT SERVICES LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES**

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of October, 2011 by Lieutenant Ron Waddell:

Attended Administrative and Command Staff meetings held at the Tomah Police Department.

Shift Supervisor on many of my scheduled shifts.

Performed Time Agency Coordinator responsibilities.

Facilitated the patrol and supervisor training schedules, including department training for Emergency Vehicle Operation Course.

Continued weekly checks and emptying of the drug drop box in the lobby.

Attended to all building/facilities issues as required.

As the Evidence Custodian I facilitated the return of evidence/found property to owners, which included the destruction of unclaimed bikes with no value.

Conducted background checks and facilitated scheduling ride-along requests.

Reviewed, prepared, and revised policies in anticipation of the 2012 policy review process.

Received orders to conduct an investigation into Personnel Complaint 11-04.

Provided fleet maintenance oversight, which included contacting FORD regarding reimbursement for vehicle repairs. Mediated the reimbursement of a department expenditure for vehicle repairs that were needed due to the improper installation of a fleet GPS unit.

Attended a Boy and Girls Club Thanksgiving dinner, where I was able to assist in serving the meal to kids and parents.

### **COMBINED TACTICAL UNIT**

#### **Monroe County Combined Tactical Unit Training Report - 11/16/11**

##### **Training:**

Training was conducted at the Sparta Police Department and the Sparta Child Care Center Gym. The first portion of training was a review of and update on tactical medical issues based on information that Officer Nelson learned at a recently completed training session in Milwaukee. The second portion of training consisted of an inventory of individual medical gear, review on proper storage/use of medical gear, and then some new officer down rescue carrying techniques. Team members had the opportunity to watch the carry techniques being demonstrated and then practice the techniques on each other without tactical gear on. Further training and practice of the carrying techniques will occur at future trainings while wearing tactical gear.

#### **Monroe County Combined Tactical Unit Training Report - 11/02/11**

##### **Training:**

Training was conducted at the Tomah Police Department firearms range and at Recreation Park. The first segment of training consisted of TPD personnel qualifying with our SL-6 37mm less-lethal projectile launcher. Other team members participated by serving as cover officers in an arrest team role with two lethal cover officers with rifles and a ballistic shield officer with a pistol. This training not only allowed TPD personnel to qualify with the less-lethal launcher but also provided team members with some live fire training in close proximity to one another and allowed for several team members to practice shooting while holding a ballistic shield, which they had not done before.

The second portion of the training was conducted at Recreation Park and was focused on our procedures for taking a subject into custody at the end of a search. Team members practiced maintaining cover of threat areas and working as arrest team members to approach, secure, assist to rise and escorted a suspect. Team members conducted two search and arrest exercises without limited input from team leaders and were encouraged to discuss their search and arrest techniques during the training, which allowed for many options to be explored and then the best option implemented.

### **SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER**

November 1st

Spoke with a student in possession of property matching the description of a stolen iPod. Further investigation conducted and it was not the stolen iPod.

Spoke with a student in regards to information they may have in related to thefts from motor vehicles during the Homecoming Dance.

Spoke with the parent of the student who reported their iPod stolen. They are attempting to locate a serial number so the stolen item may be entered into the NCIC/CIB system.

Spoke with a group of students at lunch who were walking across back yards to get to their friends house.

Received a found cell phone. In attempting to identify the owner inappropriate photo graphs were found on the phone.

Spoke with a Tomah Middle School student who was at Tomah High School during lunch. The student was called in as being home sick. The student and their sibling were warned and a parent was called.

November 2

Taught five classes of GREAT at Tomah Middle School.

During the lunch period I dealt with a middle school student who was being disorderly. Unable to contact the parent so a Tomah officer went to Wyeville to contact the parent. The parent came to school to meet with us and eventually removed the student. The student will be referred to Monroe County Human Services for Disorderly Conduct.

At the end of the school day I met with another middle school student who had created a disruption during the school day. This student threatened a staff member and also caused injury to another staff member. Student was referred to Monroe County Human Services.

November 3rd

Taught five classes of GREAT at Tomah Middle School.

November 4th

Spoke with five students with questions in regards to a paper they are writing.

Spoke with several students in regards to follow up on the theft of an iPod.

Spoke with a parent in regards to some concerns/issues they had with another student at the high school.

Spoke with a student in regards to a traffic warning they had received for an equipment violation. Also spoke with the student in regards to a previous complaint they had which was a civil matter.

Spoke with Monroe County Human Services in regards to a concern with a middle school student.

Served a citation for Habitual Truancy and Possession of Marijuana.

November 7th

Non school day. Used sick leave for scheduled appointments.

November 8th

Follow up in regards to cell phone case from the previous week.

Spoke with a student who advised the previous day they were involved in a physical altercation with their guardian and received a bloody lip. Monroe County Sheriff and Human Services contacted for further follow up.

Several contacts with student who was non-compliant with an in-school suspension. A phone call to the student's social worker and removal from the ALAC room eventually helped remedy the situation. Social worker did speak with the student over the phone as well.

Tip that a student was in possession of marijuana. Search conducted with nothing located.

Received information in regards to a new student who was fleeing from a parent in another state. There are safety concerns that the parent may show up at Tomah High School. Requested assistance from the investigator in locating more information and a picture of the parent.

Spoke with a student who had questions in regards to a paper they were writing.

Meet with a middle school student in regards to disorderly conduct behavior the previous week. I was not able to meet with the student during that time. Student was advised they would be receiving a municipal citation for Disorderly Conduct.

Meet with a student who was disruptive and physical during a class. Student was warned of consequences if their behavior continues.

Warrant arrest of a subject who came in to pick up ill sibling. Arrangements were made for subject to take student home and then be taken into custody. Subject was able to post bond for the warrants.

November 9th

K-9 search at the High School. A few locker searches were conducted with no contraband located.

Assisted with a student who was being non-compliant in the ALAC room. The student was advised of what was expected of them and advised if they did not comply they would receive a disorderly conduct citation. When the student returned to the ALAC room they continued to be non-compliant. The student was removed a second time and advised they would be receiving a Disorderly Conduct citation for causing disruptions.

Family Sick leave and then returned to the police department to work on Habitual Truancy reports.

November 10th

I spent a period of time in 1st to 4th hour Health Classes answering questions about laws.

Student requested to meet with me in regards to concerns they had with their family. Student is concerned about drug abuse issues in the home. Spoke with the social worker about the concerns.

Spoke with a student and explained to them how alternate side parking is enforced.

Scheduled lunch room supervision.

Tip received that two students were in possession of marijuana. Follow up located marijuana on one of the students. That student reported they bought it from a different student. A search of that student was negative; however, the student was taken to jail for outstanding warrants. After review of school cameras it was determined the marijuana was delivered at school. One student was cited municipally for Possession of Marijuana. The other student was booked into the jail for 3 Warrants, Bailjumping, Possession of Marijuana and Delivery of Marijuana.

November 11th

Assisted with delivering hot breakfasts to classrooms that did not have any tardy students for the week.

Spoke with a student who had concerns in regards to family issues at home.

Spoke with a student who had a spent 50 caliber round in their pocket. Student claimed someone must have dropped it in their pocket. Round was confiscated from the student.

Served six citations for Habitual Truancy.

Spoke with a parent during the evening hours upset because their 8 year old son was injured while riding on the school bus. Parent was advised I would speak with Jeff Moody about the situation.

November 14th

Taught GREAT at Tomah Middle School.

Spoke with a parent in regards to their student possible being cited for Habitual Truancy.

Attempted to speak with Lemonweir student in regards to thefts. Student was unavailable.

Spoke with Jeff Moody about the incident on the bus on November 11th. Jeff was going to make contact with both sets of parents in regards to the issue.

November 15th

GREAT at Tomah Middle School.

Served several Habitual Truancy citations to high school students.

Extra patrol at lunch at Winnebago Park in regards to students climbing into the Winnebago Park Playground equipment and it being unsafe due to the fire damage.

Met with Lemonweir School student in regards to theft.

November 16th

Assisted Investigator Walensky with interviews of 13 students who were tattooed or received body piercings without their parent's knowledge.

Spoke with a parent in regards to their student being interviewed. Parent indicated they found out about their child receiving the tattoo by accident and they were not okay with it.



Spoke with a guidance counselor in regards to a student who is returning to the high school who is now pregnant.

Spoke with Gayle Luebke in regards to graffiti in the school elevator. Gayle had determined who was responsible for the graffiti.

Spoke with two students who wanted to provide information in regards to the fire at Winnebago Park. I advised Officer Furlano they had information in case he wanted to speak with them. I later asked them to fill out written statements in regards to what they observed and gave the statements to Officer Furlano.

November 17th

Worked on reports in the morning. Training in the afternoon.

November 18th

No School.

November 21

Served citation to student in regards to Possession of Marijuana. Also answered questions student had.

November 23

Spent time talking with a student and also their siblings in regards to comments made indicating they were afraid of their father. I also attempted to contact the father but was unable to do so.

Spoke with a student in regards to questions they had in regards to a school assignment they were working on.

Cited a student for Truancy for leaving school the previous day.

Death notification to a Tomah Middle School staff member.

November 28th

Concern about some students being high after lunch. Investigation revealed they had smoked some sort of incense during the lunch hour. Some items of concern were also located. Four students were released to their parents.

Assisted Investigator Walensky with meeting with some students who wanted to provide drug information.

November 29th

Follow up with several students in an attempt to gain information about a student reported as a runaway.

Spoke with guidance counselor about a student and family concerns.

Contact with social worker from Portage County in regards to former student and concerns about the student being sexually assaulted while living in Tomah.

Follow up with Mr. Hays in regards to drug case from the previous day.

Two contacts with a student who was trespassing at the high school. Student was later served with two citations for Trespassing.

November 30th

Follow up with students again in regards to missing runaway.

Contact with a student in regards to their boyfriend pushing them down and slapping them while at school the previous day.

Contact with Monroe County Human Services in regards to students under their supervision and school issues with those students.

### **TRAINING**

Sergeant Preuss attended a training program entitled, "The Winning Mind".

Department members attended Emergency Vehicle Operator training at the Wisconsin State Patrol Academy.

### **CRIME PREVENTION/COMMUNITY RELATIONS**

I attended an event sponsored by the Tomah School District called "Dipping Dots". This was an event recognizing high school students that had no unexcused absences. The students were treated to ice cream.

I attended and volunteered at the Thanksgiving Community Dinner.

Lt. Waddell attended and volunteered at the Boys and Girls Club Thanksgiving Dinner.

Administrative Assistant Culpitt worked to get the names for our giving tree. We receive the names from Hospice and Families First.

## INVESTIGATIONS

### **[11-2052] Cocaine Deliver/Manufacture/Distribute**

Tomah Officers were at an address on the 1100 block of Woodard Avenue attempting to locate a subject who was wanted. Officers located the wanted subject and when doing so the subject discarded a baggie that contained a white powdery substance. A vehicle arrived at the location and Officers had contact with the operator. Officers observed a baggie in the vehicle that contained several smaller baggies with a white powdery substance. Two subjects were arrested and taken to jail. The contents of the baggie located in the vehicle tested positive for the presence of cocaine.

### **[11-2116] Bail Jumping, Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Underage Alcohol Possession/Consuming**

Tomah Officers responded to an address above the Bank Bar for a possible underage alcohol party. Officers arrived and were allowed inside the apartment. The investigation resulted in eight subjects receiving municipal citations for Underage Alcohol Possession/Consuming and one of these subjects also received two additional citations for Possession of Marijuana and Drug Paraphernalia. One of the subjects was taken into custody on a warrant and another was in violation of bond (Curfew) and was also taken into custody. The remaining subjects were cited and released. The two subjects taken into custody were transported to the Monroe County Jail.

### **[11-2118] Knowingly Fleeing an Officer - Felony, Bail Jumping, False Imprisonment, Battery, Operating a Motor Vehicle with a Restricted Controlled Substance, Operating After Revocation, Reckless Driving, Unreasonable and Imprudent Speed, Failure/Improper Stop and Stop Sign**

Tomah Officers responded to a disturbance call on Townline Road near Sime Avenue. Additional information was that a male and a female subject were fighting and the female asked a passer-by to call the Police. An Officer arrived in the area and located the vehicle. The Officer activated the squad cars emergency lights and the vehicle failed to stop. The vehicle led Officers on a high speed pursuit through areas of the City of Tomah and then onto Interstate 90 east bound. The vehicle eventually stopped and the driver exited and threw the keys at the Police. The driver refused to comply with multiple orders to lie on the ground. The driver was controlled with an Electronic Control Device and taken into custody. A female passenger was the victim of a battery from the driver of the vehicle. The female passenger was removed from the scene and assisted by Tomah Police Department personnel. The driver was taken to Tomah Memorial Hospital and processed for Operating a Motor Vehicle with a Restricted Controlled Substance.

### **[11-2156] Bail Jumping, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Obstructing an Officer, Possession of Stolen Property, Resisting an Officer, Warrant**

Tomah Officers received information from the Eau Claire Police Department related to a stolen cell phone. Eau Claire Police Department advised they were investigating a theft of a cell phone and were currently tracking it in the City of Tomah. Officers were able to locate an address in the City of Tomah where Officers believed the phone was probably located. Officers were allowed inside the residence and located the stolen cell phone. A female subject had attempted to flush the cell phone in the toilet along with some pills. This female attempted to consume some prescription medication and when Officers attempted to prevent this she resisted arrest. The female refused to comply and was controlled with an Electronic Control Device. The female was taken into custody. A male subject inside the residence was also arrested on a warrant. The female was medically cleared at Tomah Memorial Hospital and then transported to the Monroe County Jail.

**[11-2162] Disorderly Conduct, Resisting an Officer**

Tomah Officers responded to an address on Murdock Street for a reported disturbance. Additional information was that a male subject at this location was out of control and making comments that aliens were coming. Officers arrived and began to speak with a male and a female subject. The male subject became aggressive towards Officers and refused to comply with instructions. The male subject was decentralized and resisted attempts to place handcuffs on his wrists. An Electronic Control Device was used to control the subject. The subject continued to resist and was ultimately taken to Tomah Memorial Hospital for a medical clearance. At Tomah Memorial Hospital the male subject continued his aggressive behavior towards Officers and commented that he was going to kill an Officer by bashing his head in. The male subject was taken to the Monroe County Jail.

**[11-2172] Knowingly Fleeing an Officer - Misdemeanor, Operating After Revocation, Warrant**

A Tomah Officer was conducting speed enforcement on North Superior Avenue near Wittig Road. The Officer attempted to stop a vehicle for a speed violation and the operator failed to stop. The operator instead traveled to Kwik Trip North parking lot and parked. The Officer was able to determine the operator had a warrant for his arrest. The operator was arrested on a Monroe County Child Support warrant. The operator was cited for Operating After Revocation-5th offense. The operator was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

**[11-2188] Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated – 5th Offense – Felony, Open Intoxicant in Motor Vehicle**

A Tomah Officer was parked on the 400 block of North Glendale Avenue after completing a call-for-service. A vehicle drove past the Officer and almost struck the Officer's squad car. The Officer also observed a defective brake lamp and a defective turn signal. The Officer stopped the vehicle and when doing so the vehicle drove onto and over a curb. The operator had an opened and partially consumed bottle of vodka in plain view on the front seat. The operator was tested for impairment and taken into custody for suspicion of Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated-5th Offense – Felony. The Officer administered a Preliminary Breath Test and the final result was .222

BAC; this confirmed the Officer's suspicion that the operator was impaired due to alcohol consumption. The operator was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

### **COMMENDATIONS**

Officers Hintz and Keller and Sergeant Weaver responded to the 1200 block of Kristi Lane for a reported heroin overdose. The subject was experiencing significant medical problems. Officers Hintz and Keller provided medical assistance and CPR until such time as Tomah Area Ambulance personnel arrived on scene and took over. They are to be commended for their actions in that they saved the subject's life with their assistance.
