## OPERATIONS LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of November, 2013 by Lieutenant Mark Nicholson:

I assumed command of the department due to the retirement of Chief Wesley Revels.

I attended the monthly Committee of Whole meeting.

I completed the duties and requirements to allow for the Holiday Parade and the Holiday Train. These duties included updating the City Council as to the events, completing paperwork with the Wisconsin DOT to obtain the required detour permits, working with the Department of Public Works for detours, and working with the Monroe County Sheriff's Reserve to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all.

I attended the Coulee Region Law Enforcement Executive Group (CRLEEG) meeting held with other Law Enforcement Managers and Supervisors.

I attended the Monroe County CouleeCap meeting.

I completed requests made by the City Attorney's Office and the District Attorney's office for copies of evidence related to audio, video and pictures. I managed and processed the open records requests for audio and video related evidence

I conducted shift supervisor activities on many of my regularly scheduled shifts.

I assisted in the weekly monitoring of the Prescription Drug Drop off box located in the lobby of the Tomah Police Department.

I monitored and processed incoming temporary evidence, assuring that it was properly packaged and labeled. Once this was completed the evidence was processed into the evidence room. 132 pieces of evidence were processed into the Evidence Room throughout the month. I monitored and processed dispositions of cases in which evidence is to be disposed of.

I managed all schedule-related issues for all sworn department members. This task included schedule variations related to comp time, vacation time, court time, training time, sick leave, and special assignments. I facilitated the shift selection process and vacation selection process for the patrol and supervisory staff for the upcoming year.

I assisted in the facilitation of the departments Social Media Networks to include Facebook and Twitter.

I attended bi-weekly meetings with the other Department Supervisors.

## TRAINING REVIEW:

Training was conducted at the High Risk Entry Facility (HREF) at Volk Field and focused on Officer Down Rescue tactics with immediate medical care. During the morning we practiced several scenarios with injured officer(s) at various points in the exercise. In the afternoon the exercises were repeated with the addition of Simunitions marking cartridges to add an additional level of realism to the training. In addition to the pre-practiced scenarios two un-practiced scenarios were added to test the officers response. One scenario was a compliant and non-threatening suspect and the second was an officer who was taken hostage by a suspect. Both of these scenarios were surprises for the team members and all team members responded correctly and resolved the situation reasonably.

## **INVESTIGATIONS**

### **[13-1894] Carrying a Dangerous Weapon**

Tomah officers were dispatched to Walmart for a report of a subject pointing a firearm. Officers were given a detailed description of the suspect and located him in the parking lot. The subject was taken into custody at gun point. Officers located a firearm in the small of the subject's back. The firearm was determined to be a BB gun. The subject initially lied to officers and claimed to have never had the weapon out. The male subject was confronted with witness information and then told the truth. The male subject was issued a municipal citation and released.

### **[13-1903] Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated – 4<sup>th</sup> offense, Operating After Revocation, Probation Violation**

A Tomah officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for an improper stop at a posted stop sign. The officer contacted the operator and smelled alcohol. The operator claimed they hadn't consumed any alcohol. The operator was determined to have three prior OMVWI's and thus would make the Blood Alcohol Concentration threshold a .02 BAC versus a .08 BAC. The officer administered field tests to the operator. The officer obtained evidence through the testing and established probable cause to arrest the operator for 4<sup>th</sup> offense OMVWI. The operator refused to submit to an evidentiary chemical test of his blood. A search warrant was applied for and granted by a Monroe County Circuit Court Judge to obtain blood evidence from the operator. The operator was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

### **[13-1930] Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated – 2<sup>nd</sup> offense**

A Tomah officer stopped a vehicle for a speed violation. The vehicle operator displayed signs of impairment believed to be due to alcohol consumption. The officer attempted to administer field tests on scene but due to the inclement weather the operator agreed to go to the Tomah Police Department to complete the testing in a more controlled environment (Garage bay). The operator refused a portion of the testing but did complete others. The officer obtained evidence through the testing and established

probable cause to arrest the operator for 2<sup>nd</sup> offense OMVWI. The operator refused to submit to an evidentiary chemical test of his blood. A search warrant was applied for and granted by a Monroe County Circuit Court Judge to obtain blood evidence from the operator. The operator was processed and transported to the Monroe County Jail.

**[13-1980] Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated-1st offense**

A Tomah officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a traffic violation. The operator displayed signs of impairment believed to be due to alcohol consumption. The officer administered field tests to the operator. The officer obtained evidence through the testing and established probable cause to arrest the operator for 1<sup>st</sup> offense OMVWI. The operator was transported to the Tomah Police Department for processing. The operator's Blood Alcohol Concentration was determined to be .23 BAC; the legal limit being .08 BAC.

**[13-1981] Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated (4<sup>th</sup> offense – Felony)**

A Tomah officer was traveling on the 100 block of West Clifton Street and observed a truck fail to stop at a red light and continue through the intersection. The truck was almost struck by another vehicle. The truck was stopped and the driver was administered field tests. The officer obtained evidence through the testing and established probable cause to arrest the operator for 4<sup>th</sup> offense OMVWI. The operator was processed at Tomah Memorial Hospital and released to a responsible party.

**[13-1985] Endangering Safety by Use of a Dangerous Weapon, False Imprisonment, Failure to Comply with Officer's Attempt to be Taken Into Custody, Recklessly Endangering Safety**

Tomah officers received information concerning a male subject who had pointed a shotgun at two people. Officers were familiar with this subject and had very recently taken a complaint of false imprisonment involving this same subject. During that incident a phone technician went to the residence and wasn't allowed to leave. The male subject placed the technician in a headlock and kept him in the residence for close to three hours before he could leave. The more recent incident, involving a firearm, resulted in the VA Medical Center contacting the Tomah Police Department after learning of the allegations that a firearm was pointed at two people. Tomah officers contacted Monroe County Human Services and based on the current information were informed the male subject would most likely be placed on an involuntary emergency detention. An officer located the male subject at a hotel in the City of Tomah. The male subject refused to speak with the officer and also refused to open the door. Officers utilized bolt cutters to cut the interior hasp and gain entry into the room. A rifle and pistol were located in the room. The male subject was given a ride to the VA Medical Center and released to medical staff and the VA Police. The male subject will be taken into custody if released from the hospital.
