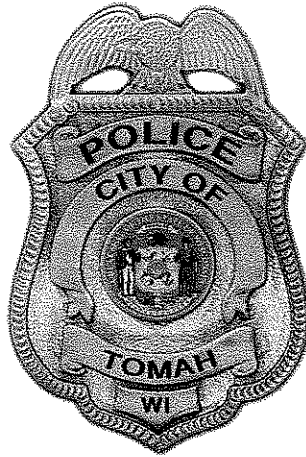

POLICE CHIEF WES REVELS

CHIEF'S ACTIVITIES

I conducted an inspection of the evidence and property room with Lieutenant's Waddell and Nicholson present.

We continue to meet with the City Administrator Bialecki and Attorney Berry working toward a negotiated agreement with American Federation of State County and Municipal Employees and the Tomah Professional Police Association labor unions.

I attended a meeting with representatives of the Our Town Tomah group.

I led a meeting of the Coulee Region Law Enforcement Executive Group.

I attended a meeting with Lieutenant Waddell and Officer Marshall and representatives from the Tomah High School for the purpose of discussing the School Resource Officer Program and the implementation of the Gang Resistance Education And Training program.

I met with Special Agent Hawks who is currently assigned to Fort McCoy with the Criminal Investigative Division. The purpose was simply to met and exchange contact information so if need be we can collaborate on criminal investigations.

I conducted a Command Staff meeting and an Administrative Staff meeting.

OPERATIONS LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of September, 2010 by Lieutenant Ron Waddell:

Conducted Shift Supervisor duties on many of my scheduled shifts.

Monitored and processed incoming temporary evidence assuring proper packaging and identification was affixed.

Managed the filling of open records for video evidence to the public.

Filled video evidence requests from the DA & City Attorney that were to be used in the prosecution of municipal or criminal cases.

Managed all schedule related issues for all sworn department members (comp, vacation, training, special assignment).

Attended Administrative Staff Meeting with Chief Revels, Lt. Nicholson, and Admin Assistant Rhonda Culpitt.

Attended Command Staff Meeting that included Admin staff, First Line Supervisor staff, and one member from the Patrol staff.

Participated in a table top exercise at the Wal-Mart Distribution Center. The "what if" exercise involved a major anhydrous ammonia spill that required immediate action by City emergency personnel. We reviewed the capabilities of the Wal-Mart Hazardous Material Team and the

Monroe County Hazardous Material Team. Each attending agency identified what their respective responsibilities would include during a major incident.

Attended a meeting with Tomah High School representatives that included discussions about the School Resource Officer, upcoming events, and school safety.

Chief Revels conducted an evidence room inspection/audit.

SUPPORT SERVICES LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of September, 2010 by Lieutenant Mark Nicholson:

Completed Evidence Custodian Duties related to the recovery, retention, and disposal of evidence. For the month of September, 142 pieces of evidence were processed into the evidence room. An inspection of the Evidence Room was also conducted by Chief Revels during the month of September.

Attended Administrative Staff and Command Staff Meetings held at the Tomah Police Department.

Reviewed FTO paperwork and processes relative to Probationary Officer Helgerson. As of September 30, 2010 Helgerson will be in Phase 2, Step 4 of the Field Training Program. During this phase Officer Schneider is her Field Training Officer. Officer Schneider will be in plain clothes during this phase accompanying Officer Helgerson as she performs all of the tasks that she has been trained to do up to this point. Upon successful completion of this phase of training Officer Helgerson will be assigned to solo patrol for the remainder of her field training program.

Attended a tabletop exercise held at the Wal-Mart Distribution Center. This exercise was attended by other emergency first responders and dealt with a mock chemical spill that occurred at their facility.

Prepared for and supervised the National Drug Drop Off Program held on September 25, 2010. During this one day event approximately seventy-five pounds of unwanted pills, creams, ointments, and cough syrups were disposed of at the Tomah Police Department. Several members of the VIPS program volunteered their assistance during this event.

TRAINING

I attended training at the Veterans Administration Medical Center. The session provided information to the participants related to homeless Veterans and the resources that are available to them.

Combined Tactical Training consisted of an After Action Review/Debrief on the last two callouts and firearms training. Firearms training was provided by Sergeant Pedersen, Officer Guralski and Sergeant Weaver. The training consisted of some techniques that we learned at a recent rifle class including several different prone positions. They worked on countering for the off-set experienced with an AR-15 rifle at close distance. Training was concluded early due to a safety concern because of lightning in the area.

Officer Sloan attended Evidence Technician training at Fort McCoy.

Investigator Walensky and Officer Westpfahl attended a one day training program on the investigation of deaths related to drug overdoses and prescription drug fraud.

Officer Marshall attended the Gang Resistance Education And Training program.

Sergeant Holum attended a training program related to Field Training Programs.

Administrative Assistant Culpitt attended a one day training program related to BadgerTracs out electronic citation process.

CRIME PREVENTION/COMMUNITY RELATIONS

I attended an Open House at the Veterans Administration Medical Center.

I assisted Chief Decorah with a commitment that he had with doing the morning announcements at the Tomah Middle School.

I attended the weekly Rotary meetings. The October 21 meeting also included a political forum.

Lieutenant Nicholson and Administrative Assistant Culpitt organized a Prescription Drug Drop Off event that was held on Saturday, September 25 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The following volunteers helped with the event: America Fushanias, Joyce Stenklyft, Kathy Pollard and Fran Pollard. We collected approximately seventy-five pounds of unwanted medications and prescription drugs. This year's event was conducted in partnership with the Drug Enforcement Agency.

I appeared on the Magnum Radio Morning Mix Radio program. We discussed Cranfest weekend and the concerns related to the increased volume of traffic.

INVESTIGATIONS

Case 10-2022 Knowingly Flee an Officer/Bail Jumping-Felony/Bail jumping/Possession of Marijuana/Resisting an Officer/Warrant arrest (Seven different warrants)

A Tomah Officer observed a vehicle being operated at night without the headlamps on. The Officer initiated a traffic stop on the 100 block of W. Washington St. The vehicle did not stop and continued onto Williams St. The vehicle did not stop after turning onto Williams St. and proceeded to the 500 block where the vehicle pulled into a driveway. When the vehicle stopped the operator exited and fled on foot. The male subject was chased and was eventually taken into custody with the assistance of an electronic control device. The subject was determined to have a Department of Corrections warrant along with six other warrants. The subject was in possession of marijuana and is also currently on two different bond conditions. The subject was transported to the Monroe County Jail.

Case 10-2031 Manufacture/Deliver Marijuana/Possession of Marijuana/Possession of Drug Paraphernalia/Underage Alcohol/Minor Transporting Alcohol

A Tomah Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle that was observed swerving. Upon contact the Officer noted the smell of marijuana coming from the vehicle. Tomah Officers asked two of the four occupants for consent to search their person and were granted consent. During the search of one of the subjects an Officer located loose marijuana that had been stuffed into the sock of this subject. All four of the vehicle occupants were taken into custody for different drug related

charges. During the search of the vehicle Officers found several items of drug paraphernalia to include rolling papers, a digital scale, a marijuana grinder and five different marijuana smoking devices. In total there was fourteen grams of marijuana seized from the occupants. Two of the vehicle occupants were taken to the Monroe County Jail.

Case 10-2033 Possession of Cocaine/Possession of Marijuana/Possession of Drug Paraphernalia/Violation of Mandatory Seatbelt Law

Tomah Officers conducted a traffic stop on Sime Ave. for a defective brake light. Tomah Officers requested the assistance from K-9 Jager and an exterior sniff of the vehicle was conducted. K-9 Jager alerted to the presence of a controlled substance and a probable cause search was conducted on the vehicle. During the search of the vehicle a five gram baggie of Cocaine was located along with five grams of Marijuana. One of the four vehicle passengers was taken to the Monroe County Jail and a couple others may face drug charges.

Case 10-2037 Resisting an Officer/ Tomah PD warrant/Tomah PD warrant/Monroe County warrant

A Tomah Officer observed a male and female subject walking on the 1600 block of Stoughton Ave. The male subject appeared to be having difficulties walking and the Officer stopped to check their welfare. As the Officer attempted contact the male subject fled on foot into several backyards. The male subject was chased and subsequently taken into custody. The subject was highly intoxicated (.207BAC) and admitted to having several warrants for this arrest. The subject was taken into custody and transported to jail, where he was booked for Resisting an Officer and three warrants.

Case 10-2050 Disorderly Conduct

Tomah Officers were dispatched to The Carlton Supper Club for a report of several subjects fighting in the parking lot. Upon arrival Officers were able to control the scene and determined three intoxicated male subjects had been involved in a physical altercation. The three subjects were issued Disorderly Conduct-Alcohol related citations with bond amounts of \$1,000 each.

Case 10-1576 Drug Investigation. Information was received that several subjects were involved in the distribution and sale of cocaine. Investigation resulted in the arrest of a male subject for 5 counts of Cocaine Del/Mfg/Dist >1<5 Grams, 4 counts of Cocaine Possession, 1 count of Warehouse, 1 count of Possession of Marijuana, 1 count of Possession of Paraphernalia and 2 counts of Possession with Intent to Deliver/Distribute within 1000 ft. Another male subject was arrested for 3 counts of Cocaine Possession, 1 count of Warehouse, 1 count of Possession of Marijuana, 1 count of Possession of Paraphernalia, and 2 counts of Cocaine Possession with Intent >40<100 Grams. A female subject was arrested for 2 counts of Felony Bailjumping, 1 count of Bailjumping and 1 count of Possession of a Schedule III Drug.

Case 10-1675 Drug Investigation. Information was received that a male subject was involved in the sale and distribution of marijuana. Investigation resulted in the arrest of a male subject for 2 counts of Possession of Marijuana, 1 count Warehouse, 2 counts of Marijuana Del/Mfg/Dist <200 Grams, 2 counts of Possession with Intent or Distribution within 1000 feet and a P & P Violation.

Case 10-1676. Drug Investigation. Information was received that a subject was involved in the sale and distribution of cocaine. Investigation resulted in the arrest of a male subject for 1 count of Conspiracy to Deliver, 1 count of Cocaine Possession, 1 count of Theft and 2 counts of Cocaine Del/Mfg/Dist 1><5 Grams.

10-1881 Drug Investigation. Information was received that two subjects were involved in the sale and distribution of prescription medication. Investigation resulted in the arrest of a male subject for 4 counts of Mfg/Dist/Del of a Schedule I & II Narcotic Drug, 1 count of Possession of a Schedule I & II Narcotic Drug and 1 count of Mfg/Dist/Del of a Schedule I, II & III Non-Narcotic Drug. A female subject was arrested for 2 counts of Possession of a Schedule I & II Narcotic Drug and 2 counts of Mfg/Dist/Del of a Schedule I & II Narcotic Drug.
