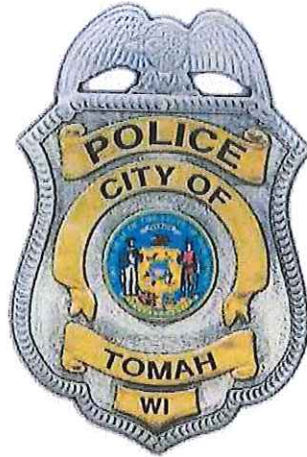


# **TOMAH POLICE DEPARTMENT**

**September 2013 Report**

## OPERATIONS LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of September, 2013 by Lieutenant Mark Nicholson:

I assumed command of the department due to the retirement of Chief Wesley Revels.

I attended the monthly Committee of the Whole meeting.

I attended a Combined Tactical Unit Administrative/Command Meeting. This is a quarterly meeting.

I attended a meeting with the Monroe County Safe Communities Coalition. This is a quarterly meeting.

I attended a meeting with the City Attorney and Municipal Judge to address changes in the OWI prosecution process dealing with blood draws and plea agreements.

I attended a county- wide meeting to discuss drug issues and the criminal justice process. The meeting was attended by other members in law enforcement and representatives from the criminal justice system to include the Monroe County DA, a Circuit Court Judge, and a representative from the Electronic Monitoring Program. The meeting was facilitated by the Monroe County Safe Community Coalition.

Attended an Administrative Staff meeting.

Conducted a Command Staff meeting.

I attended a Mental Health Executive Committee Meeting held at the Tomah VA Hospital.

I attended the Coulee Region Executive Law Enforcement meeting. This meeting was attended by other law enforcement administrators from the Coulee Region.

I attended a meeting with Communication Services to discuss issues that we are currently experiencing related to the narrowband radios.

I attended a Core meeting with members of the Department of Corrections and the Monroe County Sheriff to discuss a subject who is being released from the Sand Ridge Secure Treatment Facility in Mauston. The subject is being supervised by the Wisconsin Department of Corrections and will be living at a residence in Monroe County near Tomah. The Monroe County Sheriff's Department will be responsible for notifying the public of his release. A community informational

meeting will take place at the Tomah Police Department on October 16<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m. to provide information to the public.

I completed requests made by the City Attorney's Office and the District Attorney's office for copies of evidence related to audio, video and pictures. I managed and processed the open records requests for audio and video related evidence

I conducted shift supervisor activities on many of my regularly scheduled shifts.

I assisted in the weekly monitoring of the Prescription Drug Drop Off box located in the lobby of the Tomah Police Department.

I monitored and processed incoming temporary evidence, assuring that it was properly packaged and labeled. Once this was completed the evidence was processed into the evidence room. 132 pieces of evidence were processed into the Evidence Room throughout the month. I monitored and processed dispositions of cases in which evidence is to be disposed of.

I managed all schedule related issues for all sworn department members. This task included schedule variations related to comp time, vacation time, court time, training time, sick leave, and special assignments.

I assisted in the facilitation of the departments Social Media Networks to include Facebook and Twitter.

I attended bi-weekly meetings with the other Department Supervisors.

### **SUPPORT SERVICES LIEUTENANT ACTIVITIES**

The following is a list of tasks/assignments/responsibilities carried out in the month of September, 2013 by Lieutenant Ron Waddell:

Had the opportunity via invite to speak at the Tomah High School Student Body General Assembly on the first day of school.

Assisted Lt. Nicholson with the sale and delivery of the first vehicle on Wisconsin Surplus Auction website.

Delivered an informational speech to school administrators and clerical staff that will be responsible for "Panic Button" oversight and use. This is a part of the new security measures implemented by the school district.

Learned the process for testing the building backup electrical generator for the department.

Attended a meeting at the school district office for the purpose of identifying goals/objectives for a future "Table Top Exercise" that will involve a critical incident and the implementation of resources to identify, isolate, and respond to the incident.

Provided oversight for the completion of electrical, phone, and data line additions to a room that will be used as an office for the second investigator.

Fleet maintenance oversight continues with scheduled and unscheduled repairs.

Participated in several evaluation discussions concerning officers currently involved in the Field Training Course. Officer Steinborn is approximately a month from completing Step 5 and being granted tenure. Officer Downey is in Step 4, with hopes of being released to Step 5 (Solo Patrol) very soon.

### **COMBINED TACTICAL UNIT**

**CALLOUTS:**

**TRAINING REVIEW:**

Training was conducted in Tomah cooperatively with the Jackson County Sheriff's Department Emergency Response Team. Training began at the Monroe County Fairgrounds where we conducted a review of open area search techniques / small unit tactics and officer down rescue procedures. After the review we moved to the area of the Robert Kupper Learning Center and Tomah Police Department Range where we conducted several exercises with K-9 searches and role player suspects.

**SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER**

**Tuesday September 3<sup>rd</sup>**

Quick 50 tip of a student in possession of a one hitter pipe. Suspect student was found to be in possession of the pipe. Student was cited for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

Meeting with student and parent in regards to student not wanting to attend school. Options were explained including the truancy options.

Contact with a Middle School student in regards to not being in school. Student believed they were to attend school during an afternoon program. Student indicated they would be in school on Wednesday morning.

Spoke with a parent in regards to needing a car seat. Arrangements are being made to provide them with a car seat.

**Wednesday, September 4<sup>th</sup>**

Contact with a student who indicated their vehicle was backed into on Tuesday after school. Student provided a license plate number. Contact with the operating student, who was advised to talk to their parents and have them contact victim's parents.

Contact with a group of students in the bathroom at Winnebago Park. Everything was fine.

Follow up conversation with parent and victim student in regards to accident investigation.

**Friday September 6<sup>th</sup>**

Advised of a fight that occurred Thursday after school. Follow up needed.

Spoke with a staff member about their vehicles being entered while parked in their garage at home

Report of a bike stolen at Robert Kupper Learning Center.

### **Monday, September 9<sup>th</sup>**

Conversation with student in regards to problems they have with other kids in their neighborhood. Also follow up conversation with another high school student about this matter.

Brief conversation with a student in regards to younger sister being bullied at Wyeville School. Advised I would meet with sibling on Tuesday.

### **Tuesday Sept 10<sup>th</sup>**

Meeting with Dr. Skofronick and a student from Robert Kupper Learning Center. Student was located at Winnebago Park and escorted to the school to meet with me by Dr. Skofronick. Dr. Skofronick advised the student was observed going into vehicles in the Robert Kupper Learning Center parking lot. A student reported money missing from their vehicle, which was the one the suspect student entered. Suspect admitted to being in the vehicle but denied taking money. Suspect student's parent was contacted.

### **Wednesday, September 11<sup>th</sup>**

Spoke with student in regards to a complaint that their younger sister was bullied at Wyeville School. Information was passed on to school principal.

Spoke with a student in regards to issues they were having outside of school with an adult who was a former co-worker. Student was advised to not respond to the other subject.

Received information from two students who overheard other students talking about using marijuana.

Received information from a staff member in regards to a vehicle striking a post at Kwik Trip South earlier in the morning.

Responded to Lemonwier School in regards to a student out of control and throwing things. Parent picked up child. Child to be referred for Disorderly Conduct.

### **Friday, September 13<sup>th</sup>**

Call to LaGrange School for a student refusing to come to school and parent with the student. Eventually the parent left and student was physically carried into the school by officers.

Spoke with a student at LaGrange School in regards to theft.

I was asked to observe a student under the influence of something. Parents left student at school in Alec Room. Conversation with student resulted in student denying using anything, even though they were clearly under the influence.

Report of a student under the influence of something. Referred to administration.

Report of a student with injuries after a fight with a parent. Joint investigation with Monroe County Human Services.

**Monday, September 16th**

Called to La Grange School for a first grader refusing to come to school. Upon arrival parent was restraining the combative child. Parent eventually took child home.

Follow up with students who were found to be under the influence on Friday. It was determined that one student brought pills to school and passed them out to others.

Assisted Monroe County Detective with investigation they are working on in which a student may be a suspect.

Conversation with Intensive Sanction Program workers in regards to one of their juveniles threatening another juvenile. They spoke with student and a follow up phone call was made to victim student's mother.

Concern about an Investigator from Juneau County looking for information in regards to a student. Follow up phone call determined the request was legitimate.

Conference call with guidance counselor and social worker in regards to concerns about a student.

Spoke with two parents in regards to car seat issues/concerns.

Information exchanged with Middle School staff in regards to cell phone threats and threats to fight with each other amongst Middle School students that occurred over the weekend.

**September 18, 19, 20<sup>th</sup>**

I attended the Juvenile Justice Conference in Wisconsin. Dells.

**Monday, September, 23rd**

Ambulance called for female subject unresponsive in a classroom. Subject taken to Tomah Memorial Hospital.

Spoke with a student in regards to an incident that occurred last Friday in Winnebago Park. Suspects were talked to about their behavior.

Follow up with student and parent in regards to a stolen cell phone.

Spoke with two parents who needed car seats checked. Car seats were checked on this date.

Spoke with a student in regards to being harassed by a Monroe County Deputy. I spoke with Lt. at Monroe County in regards to the complaint. Information relayed to student in regards to how to make a complaint with the Lt.

Extra patrol request relayed to Monroe County in regards to concerns a staff member has about speeders in the area of their residence.

Contact with Sparta School Resource Officers regards to a Sparta student seen leaving the area of Tomah High School.

### **Tuesday, September 24th**

Spoke with a Detective from Juneau County in regards to looking for information on students suspected in break-ins.

Spoke with Jeff from the Transportation Office in regards to an extra patrol request at a bus stop where there are problems with children.

Responded to Middle School in regards to an uncooperative student who had left the building. Parent came and picked up the child.

Spent time reviewing student concerns with Tim Gnewikow at Tomah Middle School.

Spoke with a Middle School student in regards to truancy from school and the people/residence they were at.

Ambulance call for 22-year old male who crashed on his bicycle in the high school parking lot.

### **Wednesday, September 25th**

Assisted other officers with arrest of a student and another juvenile involved in a break-in.

Responded to Lemonwier School for an unruly child. Child was restrained by myself and principal. Referral to Monroe County Human Services. Also discussed parent's behavior with Greg Gaarder.

Spoke with a student in regards to events occurring in Winnebago Park at lunch.

Spoke with a parent in regards to their student smoking in the park at lunch.

### **Monday, September 30th**

Spoke with an upset parent whose child had contact with police on the way to school. It was explained to the parent and student that the officer stopped the child because they were going to ride their bike out into traffic and could have been struck by a car.

Spoke with FBI Agent in regards to a former student that he needed to interview.

Spoke with Special Education teacher at Lemonwier School in regards to a student they work with.



## CRIME PREVENTION/COMMUNITY RELATIONS

### INVESTIGATIONS

#### **13-1547] Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated-4<sup>th</sup> offense (Misdemeanor)**

An Officer observed a vehicle crossing the center line on Noth Avenue. The vehicle was stopped and the operator was contacted. The Officer contacted the operator and observed signs of alcohol consumption (odor of alcohol, slurred speech, red/blood shot eyes). The operator was tested for impairment and ultimately arrested for 4<sup>th</sup> Offense OWI. The operator was processed at Tomah Memorial Hospital and then transported to the Monroe County Jail. The OWI charge is a misdemeanor due to the operator's most recent conviction being more than 5 years ago.

#### **[13-1398] Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated-4<sup>th</sup> offense (Felony), No Valid Driver's License, Open Intoxicant in Motor Vehicle**

An Officer observed a vehicle speeding and subsequently conducted a traffic stop. The Officer contacted the operator and observed signs of alcohol consumption (odor of alcohol, slurred speech, open container of beer in the center console). The operator was tested for impairment and the Officer gathered evidence that established probable cause to arrest the Operator for OWI. The Officer learned this would be the operator's 4<sup>th</sup> offense (Felony). The operator submitted to a Preliminary Breath Test (PBT) on scene and the result was .208 BAC. The Operator was taken to Tomah Memorial Hospital for a legal blood draw and then transported to the Monroe County Jail.

#### **[13-1598] Public Nuisances, Obstructing an Officer**

Officers were dispatched to the area of the 700 block of West Jackson Street for a report of a subject who had defecated in the alley. Officers arrived and met with two witnesses that claim a male subject was observed squatting in the alley and left behind feces. The male subject was located in the area and identified. Initially, the male subject knowingly provided false information to Officers but eventually admitted to defecating in the alley. The male subject was cited and released.

#### **[13-1607, 13-1601] Burglary, Theft of Firearm**

Officers responded to a burglary complaint at the BP Gas Station located on East Clifton Street. Officers determined several items had been stolen from the store. On this same date Officers learned of a theft of several firearms from a residence in the City of Tomah. Tomah Officers quickly identified two suspects believed to be involved in both crimes. Officers located the suspects and several items of stolen property from the gas station. Officers searched a vehicle on the property and located items from the residence burglary. The two suspects, one being 17 and the other 16, were taken into custody. The 17 year-old admitted to being involved in the burglaries and implicated the other suspect. The 17 year-old was transported to the Monroe County Jail and the 16 year-old was transported to the Juvenile Secure Detention Center in La Crosse.
