Dear Chief Revels:

The purpose of this letter is to advise you that I have had the opportunity to review the above referenced matter regarding Mr. Kruger and allegations that he possessed prohibited materials. While the items possessed by Mr. Kruger appeared to be items of the type which could be used to produce explosive devices, and as such could easily have frightened members of the community, after thorough investigation by your officers, ATF agents, and members of the Dane County Bomb Squad this was fortunately proven to not be the case.

I have reviewed the applicable Wisconsin Statutes regarding this matter and at this time am unable to note any specific criminal statute which was violated by Mr. Kruger related to these materials that would involve endangering the safety of the public, and as such, I am unable to file any criminal charge at this time. The thoroughness with which this matter was investigated is clearly appreciated, and goes a long way toward keeping the community safe.

Accordingly, at this time, I will decline to issue criminal charges in this matter. Should further evidence arise please feel free to contact me. Thank you.
